Young Artist Designer Of TB Yule Seal

The design of the 1949 Christmas Seal features a modernistic interpretation of a dove in flight with a spring of holly. The original was drawn by a 27-year-old German-born artist named Herbert Meyers, and won for him the \$1000 first prize in a nationwide contest sponsored by the Society of Illustrators.

It is very conceivable how the dove, which is a symbol of peace, would capture the imagination of the artist who was a German refugee and who saw a great deal of action with the Eighth American air force during World War II.

Background
Meyers is now a resident of Leona, N. J., but was born in Wiesbaden, Germany, of an American father and a German mother. Art training was compulsory in his native country, and he showed considerable talent at it. Nine years ago he came to America, and to get his high school diploma he worked at a dishwasher during the day and went to school at night. After he got his hard-earned diploma he entered the U. S. army and saw three years of action in England,
