New figures from the census bureau were welcomed by Secretary of Commerce Sawyer as showing that "the job picture in November was perhaps more favorable than at any previous time this year."

VD Conference For S. Oregon Here Tomorrow

Representatives of seven Southern Oregon counties will gather here tomorrow, at the Klamath county health unit for a venereal disease conference.

Dr. Seth M. Kerron, Klamath county health officer, said units to be represented would come from Jackson, Josephine, Deschutes, Douglas, Harney and Lake counties, to join with the Klamath group.

A similar conference is slated in Portland on the same day.

The conference gets underway at 10 a. m. with Dr. Kerron presiding for the morning session which will include a discussion led by Dr. Samuel B. Osgood, head of epidemiology, Oregon State board of health. His topic will be "Changing Aspects of Venereal Disease Control."

Afternoon Following lunch, Margaret Simpson, R. N., will preside at the afternoon session. "Finding the Contact" will be the subject under discussion and led by Miss Shortal. Also taking part in the afternoon program will be Mrs. Hansel, regional nursing consultant, USPH service. Open discussion on V. D. epidemiology, with "Modern approaches to Patient Education" led by Mrs. Eleanor Fletcher, will be followed by presentation of V. D. visual aids and open discussion.

U.S. Solon Proposes FBI Role in Child Sex Crimes

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (AP)—Rep. Chelf (D-Ky.) wants the Federal bureau of investigation to be given a part in protection of children from sex crimes.

Horrified by what he called "ever-increasing" crimes of this nature, Chelf announced that he will try to make it a federal offense to molest a child sexually. He also proposed setting penalties of from 10 years to death.

The Kentuckian, a member of the house judiciary committee, said he believed such action would be as effective at curbing degenerates who prey on children as the Lindbergh anti-kidnap law has been in controlling kidnaping.

Amendment Noting that it may be necessary to amend the constitution to place such crimes under FBI jurisdiction, Chelf said he would propose such an amendment if that is needed.

The congressman said in a statement that he has been shocked to read "horrible accounts of the ever-increasing brutal slayings of this nation's children."

"Apparently," he continued, "the state laws are insufficient to cope with this great menace to society."

U.S. Engine World's Most Powerful Jet

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (AP)—The United States has a new jet engine which its manufacturers claim is the world's most powerful for its size and weight.

It weighs 2500 pounds and delivers 5600 horsepower—more than two horsepower for each pound of weight.

The new engine, built by Allison
