### RESOLUTION NO. 398

#### A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL TO PAVE AND IMPROVE HIGH STREET FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH EIGHTH STREET TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH TENTH STREET.

BY WIDENING THE PAVED PORTION THEREOF, AND JACKING AND DIRECTING CERTAIN STREPS TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, SAID PROJECT TO BE KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 104.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having filed plans, specifications and estimates for the cost of improving High Street from its intersection with North Eighth Street to its intersection with North Tenth Street by widening the paved portion thereof; and the Council, finding the said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory for said project which shall be known as Improvement Unit No. 104, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, DULY ASSEMBLED IN REGULAR SESSION AS FOLLOWS:

Section I  
That the said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portions of said street, heretofore filed by the City Engineer, be and the same are hereby approved, and said project shall be known as Improvement Unit No. 104.

Section II  
That the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said street in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates as follows:

TYPE "C"—To consist of widening the existing pavement to forty (40) feet in width and six inches in depth with concrete, including concrete curb and gutter.

TYPE "D"—To consist of widening the existing pavement to forty (40) feet in width and six inches in depth with asphalt concrete, including concrete curb and gutter.

All existing trees will be removed. All water meters, poles and fire hydrants will be lowered to pavement grade. All cross walks and driveways will be removed and replaced to meet the new alignment.

The estimated cost of all classes of improvements embracing all work and materials for the complete improvement of said project for each type of pavement being as follows:

TYPE "C"—Asphalt concrete pavement \$9,172.50  
TYPE "D"—Asphalt concrete pavement \$8,238.78

Said estimates include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical assistance, attorney's fees and unforeseen contingencies.

Section III  
That the property lying within the boundaries heretofore described be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by the said improvement, to-wit: Beginning at the most southerly corner of lot 4 block 42, Nichols Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northerly 120 feet to the most westerly corner of lot 4 of said block 42; thence along the north-westerly boundary of lots 4, 3, 2 and

1 of said block 42; thence across No. 10th street to the most westerly corner of lot 4 block 44 of said addition; thence along the northerly boundary of lot 4, 3, 2 and 1 of said block 44 to the most southerly corner of lot 4 of said block 44; thence easterly corner of lot 4 block 44 to said addition; thence southerly to the most southerly corner of lot 2 block 44 of said addition; thence across No. 9th street and along the southerly boundary of lot 2 block 44 to the most southerly corner of lot 2 of original Town; thence northerly along the northerly line of 8th street to the point of beginning. That all the property included in the aforesaid boundaries above described be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by the improvement and assessed for the expenses thereof.

Section III  
That Monday the 8th day of January, 1950, at the hour of 2:30 P. M., at the Council Chamber of the City Hall in the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be and is hereby fixed as the time and place for hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement.

Section IV  
That the Public Notice be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of such hearing to be published as provided by the City Charter of said City and shall publish this resolution as provided by law and within five days after the first publication thereof the City Engineer shall cause to be conspicuously posted at each end of the line of contemplated improvement such notice as is provided for by law and ordinance.
