

GOPs Urge Vandenberg To Set Up Attack On Demos' Foreign Policy

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 (AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) is being urged by some republicans to clear the way for GOP attacks on the administration's attitude toward China, Spain and possibly Israel.

Recovering in Michigan from a major operation, Vandenberg has informed friends here he plans to return to Washington for the opening of the new session of congress January 3.

Most of his party colleagues want the Michigan senator to clarify early in the session the republican course on the bipartisan foreign policy.

GOP Ignored
Some of those interested say frankly they hope that while Vandenberg will call for continued republican cooperation with the democrats on major foreign issues, he will point out as he has in the past that the GOP has not been consulted in advance except on decisions in a narrow field.

Senator Brewster of Maine, chairman of the GOP senatorial campaign committee, is said to believe the republicans can make issues in the 1950 campaign of the administration's handling of the China.

11 Veniremen Supplement Jury Panel

The names of 11 new circuit court veniremen have been called to supplement the regular jury panel for the December term of court.

The 11 will replace veniremen excused from the regular panel and have been ordered to report for service at 10 a. m. December 12.

Kejsar Jury Selected

A jury was selected today for a municipal court trial of James Kejsar, 47, arrested November 20 on two charges of drunk and disorderly conduct.

Kejsar pleaded not guilty and is free on \$200 bail, and his trial will be held at the city hall Friday, December 16, at 7:30. He is represented by Attorneys U. S. Balentine and Mark Simons.

The six-man jury will be composed of Gomer Jones, Burge W. Mason Jr., T. W. Bechtel, John T. Runyan, William Auxier and Phil B. Motschenbacher.

Knowland Primed
Senator Knowland (R-Calif.), primed by a trip to the Orient, apparently is coming back to Washington intent on raising Cain with the administration over what he says are the policies by which China was defaulted to the communists.

Senator Wherry (R-Neb.) and others are ready to sail into the demerits for failing to establish full diplomatic relations with Spain. Brewster may tee off on the Israel problem.

The defeat of Senator Dulles (R-NY) by democratic former Gov. Herbert H. Lehman in New York's special senatorial contest figures in the situation. In that defeat Vandenberg lost his best helper in keeping the GOP fairly well lined up behind the bipartisan foreign policy in the last session.

Dulles' Licking
The licking Dulles took is likely to strengthen opposition to the policy. This is despite the fact that Lehman told reporter on a brief visit to the capitol there never were any differences between him and Dulles on foreign policy in the campaign.

"I shall do everything I can to strengthen the bipartisan foreign policy," Lehman said.

Nevertheless, Dulles had said during the campaign that his defeat would be a blow to bipartisanship within his party. And some of his former colleagues, who never liked the program, seem willing to take him at his word.

Some of the republicans already have served notice that they will demand deeper cuts in Marshall Plan aid than the administration is likely to ask.

Attack Readied
Senator Taft of Ohio, chairman of the party's policy committee, has called for an end to the program to rearm Western European nations. Senators Malone (R-Nev.), Jenner (R-Ind.) and others will be ready for all-out attacks on most of the administration's foreign proposals.

Colleagues said all this indicates that Vandenberg, physically not as fit as he was a year ago, may face an even greater problem than he did then in keeping the bipartisan foreign policy alive.

Hunt for \$5 Ends in a Tie
