

Brownies Repeat For Flag

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 (AP)—The Philadelphia Eagles and Los Angeles Rams will bump helmets next Sunday for the National league title, plus a seat next to the Cleveland Browns of the All-America conference as co-champions of 1949 pro football.

The Browns, by routing the San Francisco 49ers, 21-7, in their play-off final in Cleveland yesterday, were champions of the now defunct AAC since its inception in 1946. Their four-year reign is a pro grid record.

The Rams had to go right down to the last game of the regular season to clinch the western division title in the NFL. They blasted Washington's Redskins, 33-27, before 44,899 coast admirers.

The triumph assured them of meeting the eastern division winners, the Eagles, in the titular playoff in Los Angeles.

Chicago's Bears, who had to win while the Rams were losing in order to overtake Los Angeles, did their part by battering the Chicago Cardinals, 32-21.

The Eagles, who locked up their third consecutive eastern division title two weeks ago and now seek a second straight NFL championship, merely made their 1949 record more impressive (11-1-0) by dusting off the New York Giants, 17-3.

STEELERS SECOND
The Pittsburgh Steelers ousted the Giants from second place in the eastern section by blanking the weak New York Bulldogs, 27-0.

The Green Bay Packers, National league kings three straight years from 1929 through 1931, again afforded evidence of how the mighty have fallen. They lost their finale to Detroit, 21-7, winding up the campaign with a 2-10 record.

Next Sunday's NFL final will come just one day before the official merger of that league and the AAC into a newly formed 13-club organization to be known as the National-American Football league.

Bob Waterfield and Rookie Norm Van Brocklin of the Rams fired six touchdown passes as Los Angeles won its first western title. Van Brocklin pitched four.

End Bob Show caught four of the touchdown passes. Another end, Tom Fears, grabbed 10 passes for a season total of 77. That smashed a league record of 74 set by Don Hutson of Green Bay in 1942.

The Rams this season won eight games, lost two and tied two.

FRISCO STUMPED
The 49ers never got started on the muddy field against Cleveland. The Browns scored 14 points before the visitors could click in front of 22,850 paying customers. The champs outgained the invaders on the ground, 217 yards to 122, and in the air, 126 to 106.

Marion Motley, Cleveland's huge fullback, made the most electrifying run of the afternoon, going 63 yards off tackle to score.

Johnny Lujack had his biggest day in leading the Bears to their easy conquest over the Cardinals before 50,101 Chicago fans. He connected for six touchdown passes and set a NFL mark for one game by passing for 468 yards.

Arkies Take Bowl Laurels
PASADENA, Calif., Dec. 12 (AP)—The Little Rock Trojans headed home for Arkansas today as the first eastern champions of the Little Rose Bowl.

The Trojans beat Santa Ana, Calif., Junior college 25-19 Saturday in the fourth annual Junior college grid classic.

Safety man Benny (Little Smack-over) Scott of Little Rock turned in the epic run of the day, a punt return that saw him reverse himself three or four times, wiggle and drop back from his own 25 to the 15, and then set off down the sidelines for the goal, 85 yards away.

A short pass into the end zone in the final three minutes of the game from Quarterback Ralph Trotlett to End Joe Shinn won the game.

McMahon Champ

CHICAGO, Dec. 12 (AP)—James (June) McMahon, 37-year-old Chicago bowling instructor, is 1949 national all-star individual match game bowling champion.

McMahon, a native of Passaic, N. J., won the title last night by finishing the 64-game round robin schedule with a record of 44½ victories and 19½ defeats. He collected 12,712 pins for 318.37 points under the Petersen scoring system.

His 318.37 Petersen total was a new record for the tourney. The old mark of 314.16 was set by Andy Varipapa of Hempstead, L. I., in 1946.

Ralph Smith of Los Angeles finished second with 307.17 points. Lee Jougard, 28, a Detroit jewelry salesman, was third with 304.32 points.

McMahon won the American bowling congress singles and all events championships at Los Angeles in 1947.

Vikings Snatch Tourney

Salem's unbeaten Vikings won the honors and Tigard's non-winning Tigers stole the show Saturday night on Pelican court as the fourth annual 20-30 club invitational high school basketball tournament came to a close.

La Grande finished second with two wins and a loss, the Klamath Pelicans third with one victory and two setbacks.

The Vikings, who figure to be one of the strongest prep teams in Oregon prep circles this year, scored a comparatively soft 53-37 win over the Pels in the final tournament game. They led all the way after taking a 10-point margin at the end of the first quarter.

Sharpshooting by Doug Rogers (14 points) and Daryl Oirod (11 points) was more than the Pelicans could cope with, and Salem's man-to-man defense was the best displayed by any of the four competing teams.

But the scene-stealing was done by Tigard in Saturday night's opener against La Grande, although the latter set of Tigers won, 42-40. Judging by previous performances, La Grande possibly should have won by 20 points.

Going into the final quarter it looked as though past performances were going to be lived up to. La Grande was ahead 21 points, 38-17, through three periods.

SHOWY THRUST
Then the Tigard Tigers, ramrodded by Dick Stearns, exploded an offense so torrid that La Grande can thank the final buzzer that it got off without a licking. Tigard whacked 19 points off the 21-point La Grande lead, the buzzer sounding just as Bob Zwings laid in Tigard's 40th point.

Forward Gilbert of La Grande had a hot streak to roll up 21 points in three periods of play, the individual high of the six-game series. Stearns paced Tigard with 16 points, 17 of them in the mad final quarter.

No all-star team was selected after the tourney, but if there had been it would be hard to keep the names of three Tigard players—Stearns, Forward Toby Lewis and Center Dick Fowler—off although the Tigers didn't win a game.

Hank Iba's Aggies, like Kentucky minus four graduated regulars, bring a 4-0 record into the Garden against Long Island university Tuesday.

Both visitors are favored but whether they will finish 1-2 again in the Associated Press poll is debatable.

Bradley university, Kentucky coach Adolph Rupp's choice as the best team in the country, plays host to Nebraska, Big Seven co-titleholder, tonight. Neither has lost a game.

Representatives of five small Oregon schools were called for a pow-wow at the Benson hotel, Portland, this afternoon to talk over establishment of an Oregon intercollegiate athletic league.

Invitations were issued to Oregon Tech of Klamath Falls, Southern Oregon of Ashland, Oregon College of Education at Monmouth, Eastern Oregon College of Education at La Grande and Vanport of Portland.

Winston Purvine, OTI director, and Cage Coach Skeets O'Connell are attending the session from Oregon Tech, and both are in favor of establishment of the conference.

The meeting was called by Dr. H. M. Gunn, president of OCE.

Purvine said an effort would be made to get the conference organized for basketball this season, and OTI students have already voted to include baseball in their sports activity for next spring.

Football will also be included in the proposed five-team conference, and possibly track.

Southern Oregon already belongs to the five-team Far Western conference with four California teams but is reported to be in favor of joining the Oregon conference also.

If the league is organized, Purvine said, two basketball games the Ows have already played with Southern Oregon probably will be counted as league games. The Ows and Raiders split, and have another game at Ashland Tuesday night.

The Ows have cage games with OCE and Vanport on their schedule for this season.
