Fred Astaire Hopes Old Charleston Isn't Revived

HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 12 (AP)—Is the Charleston coming back? Fred Astaire hopes not.

The famed and frenzied dance of the roaring '20's has been making a reappearance at college dances, society parties and in Broadway shows. It is part of a throwback to another postwar era, a trend which has also brought renewed interest in the raccoon coat, ukulele, mah jong and the bobbed haircut.

Dance King Astaire thinks — and hopes — the new Charleston craze will be a flash in the pan.

"I suppose it's a novelty to youngsters who weren't even born when it was first danced," he commented. "It must look like fun to them. But I don't think it will make a comeback."

"For myself, I'm not interested in old dances. I'm always looking for new ones."

Astaire admitted to being a Charleston dancer himself. "My sister Adele and I danced it to a Gershwin tune in 'Lady Be Good' in London," he recalled. "It created a lot of talk." He also confessed having owned a raccoon coat.

Veterans today are experiencing less difficulty in obtaining low-interest mortgage financing for homes purchased with loans guaranteed under the GI bill than at any time in the past two years, the veterans administration has announced.

Applications have been rising steadily since April, 1949, when the long downward trend was reversed, the VA said.

A number of factors were cited as probably responsible for the upturn. These included the large amount of money supplied through the Federal National Mortgage association for the purchase of GI loans from private lenders, an increased willingness on the part of private investors to finance mortgage loans at 4 per cent interest, and the greater availability of lower-priced homes.

Prospects of obtaining a 4 per cent mortgage financing for the purchase of veterans' homes should be even further improved by a new law which became effective on October 25, 1949, according to the VA. This law expands the mortgage purchase authority of FNMA, permitting sale to the government by private lenders of most GI mortgages without restriction.

Eligible veterans have nearly 8 years left in which to use their loan guaranty rights. In view of this, and the fact that it is a benefit that may be used at once, the VA advised veterans to consider all factors carefully to avoid rushing into what may prove an ill-advised purchase. The veteran should be convinced that the price is well within his ability to pay, the VA cautioned.
