The maestro took to the piano at the tender age of five, and has been going at it ever since.

Record dates with the Decca Recording company succeeded and his first album release was the now popular "Dancing in the Dark" collection. Others that were waxed are "Getting Sentimental Over You," "All the Things You Are," "I'll See You in My Dreams," "Strauss Waltzes" and the recent "Serenade" album.

Lakeview Contracts For Grader; Fills Park Vacancy

LAKEVIEW — The Lakeview town council, in its final regular meeting of 1949, okayed a contract to secure a street grader, on a lease with option to buy basis; and also named Douglas Fetsch to the town park board to succeed T. R. Conn, whose term expired November 19.

The grader was ordered to replace the town's 12 year old Austin-Westley machine which has become badly depreciated and is costly to maintain. The council had bids on three types of machines: Adams, Gallion and Caterpillar. The bids were similar except that the town was offered the lease with option to buy on Caterpillar.

The council approved the contract with the Crater Lake Machinery company, Klamath Falls, for a Model 112 Caterpillar grader. The lease is for a seven months period, December 10, 1949 to July 19, 1950 at a rental of \$2900. The company, in the contract agreed to take the Austin Western, allowing \$1050 on it; and taking the remainder of the rental at \$250 per month. Should the town decide to agree to buy the grader at the end of the lease period, the \$2800 paid as rental would be applied in full on the purchase price of \$11,200. The balance could be paid in two annual installments: \$4215 on July 10, 1950 and \$4215 on July 10, 1951.

Objection Mayor Harry Osterman objected to closing the deal at this time, as he goes out of office the end of this month and he did not wish the action to obligate the incoming council members.

The appointment of Fetsch to the park board is for a five-year term. Other members are Eddie MacKay, chairman; E. G. Favell, Everett Osterman and Mrs. Richard Proebstel.

POWER RECORD

SEATTLE, Dec. 13 (AP)—New power production records by Bonneville and Grand Coulee dams were in the books today. The Bonneville power administration said the two dams generated 2,065,000 kilowatt hours of electricity between 3 p. m. and 6 p. m. Thursday night, and 40,999,999 kilowatt hours in a 24-hour period. Both broke previous marks.
