

Committees Report At TB Meeting

Committee reports were the order of the day at the December 7 meeting of the Klamath Tuberculosis and Health Association presided over by Mrs. E. A. Geary, vice president.

Mrs. W. A. Shannon outlined the progress of the Christmas Seal Sale although it is too early to determine the degree of success. She urged continued effort on the part of all connected with the campaign because the TB association has plans for a greatly expanded program in the coming year, including chest X-rays over the entire county. The publicity scrapbook compiled by Mrs. C. E. Houston was displayed.

New Member
A new member of the health education committee, Dr. Don Rice, was introduced. The report from this committee centered around the clean-up campaign organized by Dr. Buford Hargus. In addition to newspaper publicity and short talks before club groups, it was mentioned that Boy Scouts covered the city with posters about the Christmas Seal Sale and the clean-up campaign. It was emphasized that this was the preliminary push given to such an undertaking, and that next spring will see a bigger program, since several service clubs and the

garden club have promised their cooperation then.

Mrs. A. Ivan Thompson reported that contacts on behalf of her family relations committee have been made in person or by letter to Parent-Teacher groups, and ministers. She outlined a recent meeting at the home of Mrs. Oscar Klittridge, association president, with Mr. Murphy of the Mental Hygiene Society of Oregon.

X-ray Plans
The annual free chest X-ray is being planned and organized by the case-finding committee headed by Clay Bellisle, and Dr. Seth Kerron, county health officer as consultant, and Mrs. James Brown as volunteer worker who was introduced for the first time to the group. The

time of year for the portable X-ray unit to be in the county has been set for May, and it is planned to have one more day than last year, the extra time to be devoted to examinations of food handlers, on the advice of Dr. Kerron.

The long-range plan of this committee is to have complete county coverage within three years so that early cases which can be diagnosed only by a chest X-ray may be discovered and checked, helping the infected persons themselves and the people with whom they come in contact. A staff meeting with Dr. Kerron will be held soon to make more definite plans.
