

Bids for 33 Farm Plots In Tulelake Area Being Accepted

Advertisement of bids for the leasing of approximately 6147 acres of land in the southwest portion of the Tulelake sump area of the Klamath Project has been announced by K. L. Stephens, project manager, Bureau of Reclamation.

This block of land includes 33 units, each consisting of from 113 to 210 acres of irrigable land. The average irrigable acreage per unit is 171 acres.

The lease area is reserved for sump purposes during any time the restricted sump is inadequate. The land had been reclaimed by lessees who have built dikes and installed pumping units for irrigation and drainage.

The lessees will also be expected to assume responsibility for maintenance of all existing dikes. The equipment now in place on the area belongs to former lessees who have the right to move their equipment by January 31, 1950.

Announcements regarding the leasing of his land have been posted at the office of the Bureau and the following post offices: Bonanza, Fort Klamath, Keno, Klamath Falls, Malden, Merrill, Midland and Walden, 1 Oregon and Alturas, Dorris, Tulelake and Yreka in California.

In the event adequate bids are not received from World War II veterans to lease the 33 lots, sealed proposals will be accepted from the general public 10 days after above date of opening or until 2 p. m. January 1, 1950.

Maps showing the location of the 33 units for lease may be purchased from the Bureau of Reclamation, Klamath Falls, or may be inspected at any of the post offices named.

Leases will be made for one year with the lessee having the option to renew the lease at the same rental price for an additional four years.

Any bidder holding an agricultural lease contract in the Klamath project at the time of the opening will not be eligible for an award under this advertisement.

Payment of the first year's rent for the initial period ending December 31, 1950, must accompany the proposal. All payments must be by cash, certified check, cashier's check, bank draft, or money order, made payable to the Treasurer of the United States.

Deposits or proposals not used will be returned to the bidder promptly. Veterans receiving awards will be required to present evidence of their discharge.

Subleasing of any of the lands will be prohibited. Neither the lease or any interest therein shall be transferred by the lessee without the written consent of the officer who executed the lease on behalf of the government.
