# Voters Favor Registration Of Commie Party Members

PRINCETON, N. J.—Public sentiment in favor of requiring all members of the American Communist party to register their names with the federal government has reached overwhelming proportions, probably as a result of the conviction two months ago of the 11 top leaders of the party on charges of advocating overthrow of the government.

While public opinion surveys have in the past found a substantial vote in favor of the Communist registration idea, sentiment today runs 7-to-1 for it, as shown in a series of reviews throughout the country on the following question:

"Would you favor or oppose a law requiring all members of the Communist party in this country to register (file their names) with the Justice Department in Washington?"

The vote today as compared to August, 1948, when a similar question was asked, is shown below:

The registration proposal was contained in the Mundt-Nixon bill which came before the 80th Congress and was the subject of widespread and intensive debate. The bill was finally shelved.

**Outlaw the Party?**  
The conviction of the Communist party leaders also raised anew the question of whether the American Communist party should be allowed to continue as a legal party.

Many liberals have opposed outlawing the Communist party on the grounds that the party is not a sufficient threat to warrant such a drastic step and also that outlawing it would drive it underground.

These arguments have never made much impression on the general public. Institute surveys have

found consistently large majorities in favor of outlawing the party. In the most recent test of sentiment on the issue the vote is more than 4-to-1 for abolishing the party, as follows:

"Do you think membership in the Communist party in this country should be forbidden by law?"

Should not 21  
No opinion 11

However, voters who have had the most education are least convinced that outlawing the party would be wise. Here is the vote by degree of education:

An important sidelight on the issue is that Australia's new Prime Minister Robert Menzies, in campaigning for the election December 10, made outlawing of the Australian Communist party a major plank in his platform, stressing it heavily in all his speeches.

**The Question of Loyalty**  
The underlying reason why so many persons favor registration of the Communists and outlawing of the party is that they do not consider American citizens who are Communists to be loyal to the United States.

Surveys on that issue last year showed that 23 per cent of the voters think American members of the Communist party are loyal to the United States, while 56 per cent think they are loyal to Russia and 21 per cent have no opinion.

## Multnomah Fair Feud Flares

PORTLAND, Dec. 23 (AP)—Multnomah county's commissioners faced opposition today in their attempt to reorganize the county fair.

The County Fair association asserted last night that it owned the property at the fairgrounds. Fair directors ordered A. H. (Bert) Lea to ignore the county commissioners and to continue to take instructions from the association board of directors.

The county commissioners had voted to cancel the association's contract to lease the fairgrounds. They announced they would name a new fair board. The vote followed an auditor's report that said the fair management had accounted for money only loosely.
