So as I sit here thinking of something Christmas to say, I have only one wish for you all.

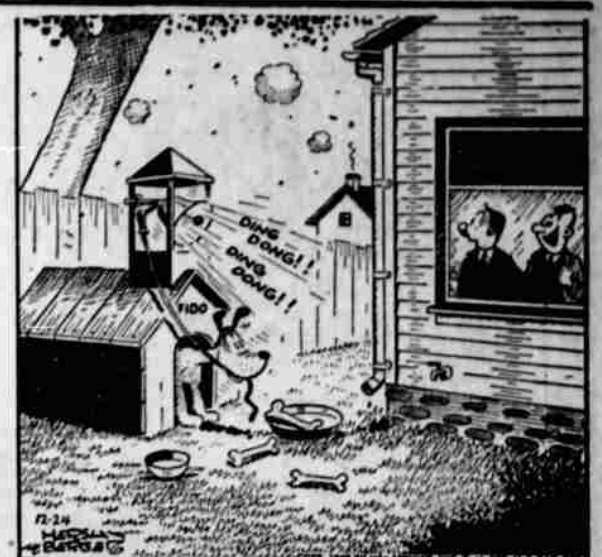
I wish that during this Christmas season you may have all your loved ones together, and that the spirit of that first Christmas some 1949 years ago may prevail in your hearts.

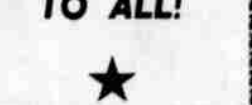
County Tax Collections Nearly 82%
