U.S. to Buy N.W. Apples

PORTLAND, (AP) — The government will buy 264,000 boxes of surplus apples from Washington, another 30,000 from Oregon growers this year.

The purchase program, disclosed here Wednesday by a department of agriculture spokesman, was begun October 1. It will continue through December 31, although the deadline for offering apples to the government will come November 10.

Jonathan, golden delicious and some beauty varieties will be bought with prices ranging from \$1.90 down to \$1.60 a box. Last year the government paid \$1.65. The apples go to the school lunch program.

If another purchase program is needed, it will be held after January 1 with newtons and winesaps on the purchase list.

Auto Rammed, Hits Back

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Movie Runs Into Red Scribe Snarl

LOS ANGELES, (AP) — A Hollywood movie got a different kind of "premiere" yesterday.

There were lots of people outside as the film "Kind Lady" opened at the Four-Har theater, but they weren't fans—they were pickets.

The pickets carried signs saying the screen story was written by a man who has been named as a Communist.

The story was written by Edward Chodorov. A spokesman for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer said the studio bought the play from Chodorov in 1935 and hired Chodorov to help prepare the script. The studio said now.

Screen writer Martin Berkeley recently told the house subcommittee on un-American activities that Chodorov was a Communist.

The pickets were members of the wage earners committee, a group which in the past has campaigned against "labor bosses."

The committee recently conducted a nationwide presidential poll on Gen. MacArthur and Eisenhower. It said the vote gave MacArthur a wide margin. The group claims 100,000 members.

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) — Exclusively Yours' Evangelist Billy Graham isn't worried about "wicked" Hollywood's soul.

"I was surprised, when given the facts and through some personal observation, by the number of church goers and normal families in Hollywood," the young personality boy of old-time religion told me between revival meetings at the Hollywood Bowl.

"I'm going to defend Hollywood on my radio and TV shows. Just because a few movie people make the headlines doesn't mean Hollywood is a land of sin."

Billy's about to premiere a \$50,000, full-hour movie, "Mr. Texas," financed by his followers. "It's a western with Biblical overtones," he said. "Texas oil millionaires who don't find true happiness and peace until I convert him."

Inspired by Glenn McCarthy? "No," Billy grinned, "but I hope he sees the picture."
