Baptist Meet Slated Here

The first annual session of the Klamath Baptist association will be held at the First Baptist church Monday and Tuesday, according to announcement by Dr. E. M. Causey, pastor of the First Baptist church.

The meetings will begin at 7 p. m. each day.

Out-of-town speakers will include Dr. R. E. Milam, executive secretary-treasurer of the Baptist general convention of Oregon-Washington, from Portland; Rev. and Mrs. B. L. Millard, field workers from Grants Pass, and Mrs. Hazel Kramer, youth leader, from North Bend.

Rev. L. R. Adams, Dorris Baptist pastor, will preside over the sessions. Other church leaders scheduled to appear on the two-day program are Verne Griffith, Rev. W. P. Weeks, Rev. L. W. Rowland, Fred Nichol, Jack Gray, Lloyd Samson, Rodney Larson, Mrs. Gray and Dr. Causey, all of Klamath Falls. Rev. C. A. Waterhouse of Keno and Rev. G. C. Griffin of Lakeview.

The church of the association will give statistical reports of work for the fiscal year just past, and there are to be discussions on such subjects as Christian education, missions, temperance, Christian literature, Sunday school and other organizational work, and stewardship.

The annual meeting of the Klamath Baptist women's missionary union will be held at the church Tuesday, 2 p. m. Mrs. Jack Gray will receive reports of member unions, and officers for the ensuing year will be installed.

Dedication Set for New Church Bells

The Schulmerich electronic tower bells—recently installed in the Klamath Lutheran church—will be dedicated and played for the first time here when the congregation convenes Sunday morning.

The bells were presented to the church by an anonymous person, and will be played before Sunday school, worship hour and following worship.

Mrs. A. H. Denison, organist, will play two hymn tunes on carillon bells during the dedication rites.

The bells are of English type, and have 25 tones. Rev. Irvin Tweet, who will officiate at the dedication, reports they will be used for simple hymns, folk songs and patriotic music.

A Westminster-hour strike clock will control the bells during the week, chiming out at hourly intervals during the day.

During festival seasons such as Christmas and Easter, recital music will be heard, Rev. Tweet reported.

Under normal conditions, he said, the harmonically tuned bells are audible for a distance as great as two miles.

Special Youth Service Set

Jean and George Friesen, working under the auspices of Youth of Christ, will conduct a special service at Klamath Temple Saturday, 8 p. m., immediately following the church broadcast.

During the service they will show a sound film "Seeds of Destiny."

Mr. and Mrs. Friesen are making their final tour before leaving for Europe where they will serve as missionaries. At 7:30 p. m. Saturday Rev. D. B. Anderson will continue his prophetic talks on "The Coming Crisis and the Coming Christ."

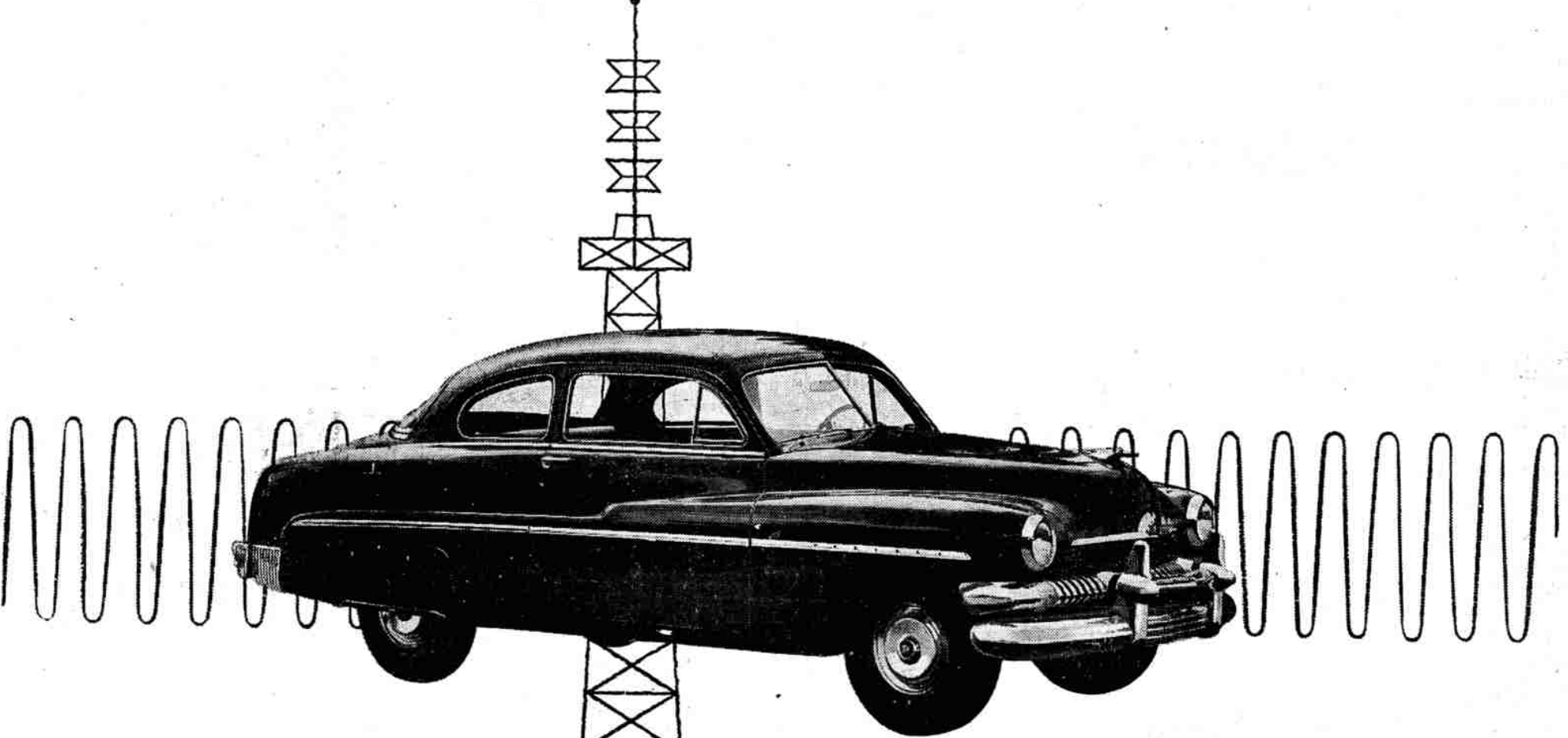
