Infant Dies During Night

A 3-month-old baby, Carla Marie Butts, was found smothered in a makeshift bed at its home, 920 1/2 Klamath, this morning.

The child was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Douglas Butts. Mrs. Butts said she gave the baby its bottle about 4 a.m. and returned to bed. She found little Carla dead shortly after 6:30. Apparently the child had turned over in the seat of an upholstered chair where it was held down and where its head face down in a corner of the chair.

The body was taken to Ward's funeral home. Mrs. Butts said the child was born at Bandon. They moved to Klamath Falls about five weeks ago. Butts works at Weyerhaeuser Timber company and there are three other small children in the family.

Mirth Brings Man's Arrest

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (AP)—A man was laughing so hard last night in a downtown movie that the woman in front of him turned around to look.

Then she ran out and called the police—she had recognized him as a man wanted in connection with the fatal shooting of his wife.

Police said they arrested Ralph Rogers, 26, of Fort Wayne, on a manslaughter charge. He disappeared last Saturday shortly before Rachel was found in the basement of their home.

A three-state police net had failed to show a trace of him, until the woman called from the movie.

Gables Start Legal Battle

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The legal duel between the Clark Gables is under way. Mrs. Gable, the former Lady Sylvia Ashley, made the first thrust by filing suit for divorce recently in Santa Monica.

Gable parried by establishing residence in Nevada. Yesterday he returned the attack by filing his own divorce suit at Las Vegas, and the battle was joined.

Each charges cruelty. Gable says there is no community property. Mrs. Gable's attorney, however, said he wanted to see the actor's income tax reports.

Mrs. Gable said originally that all she wanted was a divorce.

If she wanted separate divorces, several difficult questions will arise: Which divorce is legal? Will Gable, holding a Nevada divorce have to pay alimony granted in the California court? Could Gable escape California divorce payments by moving to Nevada?

Mrs. Gable's attorney says the case will be a test of California divorce law.

ACTOR'S ESTATE
LOS ANGELES (AP)—Actor Robert Walker's will leaves his \$100,000 estate solely to his two sons, Robert Jr., 11, and Michael, 10. Their mother, actress Jennifer Jones, was excluded in the terms of the will, filed yesterday for probate. The will said a financial settlement had been made with Miss Jones, from whom he was divorced. A codicil also excluded Walker's divorced second wife Barbara Ford daughter of director John Ford.

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English Quit Parliament

LONDON (AP)—The house of commons wound up its affairs today with traditional decorum, putting aside momentarily its anger over the loss of the oil refinery at Abadan and shock at the nose dive of Britain's gold and dollar assets.

The formal preparations to dissolve parliament in advance for the October 25 elections went off without a controversial hitch. The impartial speaker ruled out of order an attempt by independent member Raymond Blackburn to prod Laborite Prime Minister Clement Attlee on his government's handling of the Iranian oil crisis.

All that remains now is the for-

mal dissolution by the king tomorrow.

Both the loss of Iranian oil and the country's financial plight are expected to be hot issues in the forthcoming elections.

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Priest Kicks About Reds, Defrocked

FRESNO, Calif. (AP)—A Fresno Armenian priest has been defrocked for leading his congregation out of the mother church after

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accusing it of being Communist-dominated.

Vartan Kasparian, San Francisco, archbishop of the California diocese of the Armenian Apostolic church, yesterday reduced the Rev. Y. Egenhe Mekhitarian to layman.

Mekhitarian and his congregation bolted the mother church last Friday.

They charged that church headquarters, in Soviet Armenia, had ordered:

1. Support of the Kremlin-sponsored Stockholm peace peltium.
2. Denunciation of "American

aggression in Korea."

3. Celebration of the day Armenia became a Soviet state as a holy day.

A spokesman for Mekhitarian's congregation said he will continue

as pastor and that he has been given an unanimous vote of confidence.

Archbishop Kasparian said his church always has been loyal to the United States.

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
