This is the man you hear just before the "Breakfast Club" starts every morning. He's Jay Sims, who presents "Inside News" from Hollywood, 7:55 a.m. Monday through Friday. As the title indicates, Sims gives news of the stars and activities in the film capital. He started out to be a lawyer, but decided he'd rather do his talking before a microphone than a jury. Besides the show-business gossip on "Inside Hollywood" Sims is the world events newscaster of the "News of the Day" newscast.

"Buzz Adlam's Playroom" tonight at 7:00, will have Barbara Fuller as honored interview guest. She's a well-known young radio actress, who's also been featured in motion pictures. And there'll be more good music by the orchestra and vocals by the audience.

"Town Meeting of the Air" will be back tonight, but tune in one hour earlier, at 8:00 p.m. A subject which has caused coast-to-coast controversy, "McCarthyism: Good or Bad?" will be thoroughly discussed. Speakers will be Rep. Charles J. Keenan, (R.) of Wisconsin, who worked as special assistant to Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy during the Tydings investigation, and Rep. Richard Bolling (D.) of Missouri, member of the House Banking and Currency Committee.

Listen tonight too, for the next episode of Stefan Donner in the current "Proudly We Hall" series. The program has been broadcast heretofore on Sunday afternoons, and moves to Tuesday nights at 9:00.

The second Northwest Artists broadcast will be heard tonight during the "Memorable Music" half-hour, 9:20-10. Arthur Hitchcock, Professor of Music at the University of Portland School of Music, opens the program with the playing of Rachmaninoff's Prelude in G Sharp Minor.

Culprit Has False Proof

SAN FRANCISCO, (AP)—Martha Stelling refuses to hire a lawyer—she figures she has a perfect defense.

A tenant, Emma Smith, is suing her for \$10,500 damages, claiming Mrs. Stelling bit her. The two elderly women had an argument over whether the rent check or the recent receipt should change hands first.

Mrs. Stelling testified Mrs. Smith called her a Communist. And Mrs. Smith testified she only said Mrs. Stelling acted like a Communist.

Mrs. Stelling appeared as her own counsel in court yesterday. She told the judge every lawyer she contacted insisted their own physicians examine Mrs. Smith.

"Why should I pay for that when I didn't bite her," Mrs. Stelling declared. It was impossible, she added.

"I have false teeth."

He died in 1914 and was beatified June 3, 1931, the first pontiff to receive the honor in 272 years.
