Jewish Holy Day Tomorrow

JERUSALEM, (AP)—From the mountains of Galilee to the Red sea, and from the Jordan river to the Mediterranean coast, will be a silent country tonight and tomorrow.

The silence will come in observance of Yom Kippur, the day of atonement, most sacred festival in the Jewish calendar.

It marks the culmination of 10 days of penitence which began with Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish new year. Secular life will be stilled completely from sundown tonight until sundown tomorrow. Fasting will be widespread.

Hundreds of thousands will spend the 24-hour period in synagogues or improvised religious centers. They will recite ancient prayers, eulogize the dead and in one the palms until a long blast from the ram's horn—the shofar—announces the end of the service.

Israel's 77-year-old Pres. Chaim Weizmann will go to one of Jerusalem's synagogues for his devotions. In this holy city a special ceremony also will be held on Mount Zion, in front of King David's tomb. Many orthodox Jews will go there on pilgrimage.

Rules on fasting were relaxed somewhat in view of the effects of Israel's economic austerity. Doctors warned persons over 60 not to fast, as continued undernourishment had weakened considerably the physical resistance of the aged.

But it appeared that few would heed the medical advice.

Oldest Known Village Open

CHICAGO, (AP)—The oldest known village in the world—discovered in 1946 by accident—has been uncovered by University of Chicago archeologists.

The scientists reported yesterday that Jarmo, a village outside the modern oil town of Kirkuk, in Iraq, had been scientifically "recovered."

Robert J. Braidwood, professor of old world pre-history, estimated the village dated back to 5000 B.C. and was the size of a small city block. He said it was found to contain 15 different levels, with the lower two third representing a pre-ceramic stage and the upper third the pottery stage. The village was made up of about 50 mud-walled houses.

The site of Jarmo was discovered by accident in 1946 by an Iraq official of the Iraq directorate general of antiquities. A village sheik was observed using a flint and steel to light a cigarette and it was found that the flint proved to be a finely worked product of the late stone age. The sheik showed where he found the flint and Jarmo's site was discovered.

Braidwood, recently returned from a year's excavation in Iraq, said the site has been completely excavated and it gives clear evidence of village life in an efficient peasant economy.

Editor Goes To Bat For Wayne Morse

SALEM, (AP)—Charles A. Sprague, former Republican governor of Oregon, has entered as an editor, the fight between Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) and Col. Robert McCormick, publisher of the Chicago Tribune.

McCormick has criticized Morse for not being a true Republican. Morse replied that the criticism was not true. In his column, "It Seems to Me," which appeared in Sprague's paper the Oregon Statesman today, Sprague said that though Morse is a "naughty maverick," he is "a better Republican than Col. McCormick."

"We have few Republicans as mentally sterile and politically frozen as the editor of the Chicago Tribune," Sprague wrote. "The threat is real (that) this political philosophy may prevail. It is fortunate for the party and for the country that someone with the intellectual capacity, the moral force and the courage of Wayne Morse stands ready to challenge the journalistic troglodyte of Tribune tower," Sprague said.

Henry Williams, Henley, was a third-place winner in the one-half blood fleece competition of the Pacific International exposition now underway in Portland, according to word received here.

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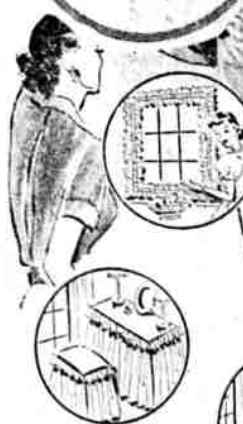
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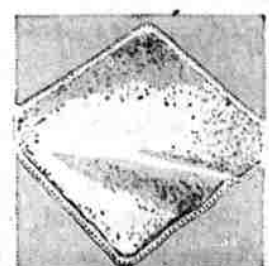
