Car Makers Trying Many New Substitute Materials

By DAVID J. WILKIE, Automotive Editor. DETROIT. — Substitute materials developed for motorcars... particularly in shiny trim—will get a good testing in the months ahead.

Even in normal times winter car operation is tough on paint and plating. It is tough, too, on sheet metal generally, especially at the joints where parts are bolted together.

WINTER CARE. In the current defense emergency the industry has had to make many substitutions in processing experts say frequent washings with clean, cold water, give the best assurance of minimizing winter damage.

The substitutions haven't dulled the glitter on new cars. But they have prompted the car makers to suggest out of the ordinary care for such parts as radiator grille bars, lamp rims, window frames and hood ornaments.

While these parts have continued to receive a chrome plating it has been found necessary also to bake on a coating of transparent, colorless enamel.

Aside from frequent washings, the car makers recommend that these parts generally be left alone for the first 90 days. Particularly they urge that no polish or wax be used on them during that time.

Hoover Sees School Peril

KENMORE, N.Y. (AP) — Herbert Hoover said today American education must never be surrendered to Washington bureaucracy and political influence.

Public education is "a grass roots enterprise," the former president said in a prepared address at ceremonies dedicating a school named for him.

"The federal government has had no important part in its origin, its growth or in its administration," Hoover said. "I hope it never will."

"If we surrender the welfare of our children and the independence of our higher education to a Washington bureaucracy, we abandon the first obligation of parenthood and we endanger an essential defense of our freedom."

Hoover recalled the old saying that "eternal vigilance is the price of liberty," and added: "But the vigilantes require education free of political influence if they are to be any good for this job."

Disabled Workers Back On The Job. WASHINGTON, (AP) — The federal security agency said today a record-breaking 66,193 disabled in 1950 were returned to employment under the state-federal rehabilitation program during the year ending June 30, 1951.

This is the peak in the 21-year history of the program, said Mary E. Switzer, director of the agency's office of vocational rehabilitation in a statement.

But she added that it still is in a way from meeting the need for 250,000 rehabilitations a year "just to keep abreast of the annual incidence of serious disabilities."

Miss Switzer said that during the federal-state program 600,000 persons have been rehabilitated, 462,000 of them in the past eight years.
