ST. LOUIS, (AP)—A letter soliciting funds for a Harry S. Truman memorial library and mentioning the possibility of tax savings for those donating brought a sharp rejoinder from the White House.

Officer Wins Assault Case

A not guilty verdict was returned in the first of two assault and battery cases against Bonnie Stephens, Malin police judge, and the second has been postponed.

The first trial, on a charge brought by Charles Peck, 63, who held yesterday morning in district court, and Judge Nick Carter took the case under advisement after the testimony was in.

Stephens, 38, was accused of beating Peck at Malin in the course of an involved argument growing out of the rental of a cabin owned by Peck. Stephens said it was self defense.

Yesterday afternoon Judge Carter said he would find Stephens not guilty of the assault.

The second assault and battery charge against the Malin officer was brought on behalf of Daniel Thomas McAuliffe, 12, whom the officer is accused of beating September 27.

Trial on that count was scheduled for Friday, 10 a. m. in district court, but the district attorney's office asked for more time to contact witnesses.

Heart Attack Kills Gridder

LEBANON, (AP)—A Lebanon high school senior suffered a heart attack in a touch-tackle football game here Monday, and died two hours later.

He was Philip McCormick, 17, son of Cyrus McCormick, Lebanon. A member of the school track team and active in student affairs, he complained of pains in his head and arm while playing in the intra-mural game. He quit and went home, and died in a doctor's office two hours later.

CLEVELAND, (AP)—A 27-year-old mother was fined \$25 Monday for assaulting a school principal with the same paddle he once used on her son.

Mrs. Bernice Brey had been convicted of assault and battery by a jury. She blackened the eyes of Principal James Fenwick during an argument in his office over his punishment of her son, Dan, 15.

In a lecture accompanying the fine, Municipal Judge Mary B. Grossman told the woman to "Join the parent-teachers association and get a better understanding of the teacher-parent problem."

The judge also ordered the Cleveland school board informed that Fenwick's three-foot, inch-thick paddle should not be used on children.

"It was just as bad for this paddle to be used on children as it was to be used on the principal," Judge Grossman said.
