10 Scheduled For Induction

Ten young men, registered with the Klamath Falls draft board, are slated for induction into the armed forces November 6.

The call is the 19th since selective service was reactivated in 1948 and the 14th since the Korean war started in June, 1950.

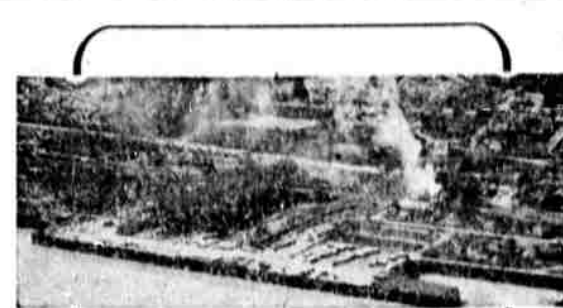

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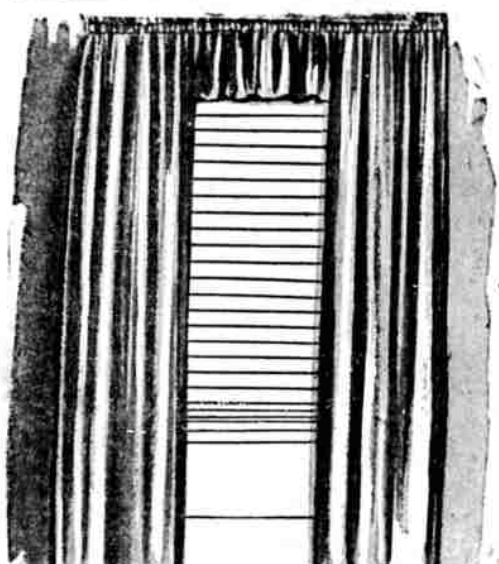
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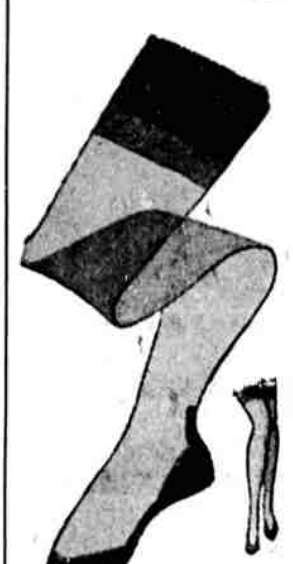
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
