Aluminum Nails May Prove Economical in Many Cases

 That old chestnut about being penny wise and pound foolish seems particularly appropriate in the case of aluminum, once regarded as a luxury metal, but in recent years proven extremely economical and useful.

EFFECTIVE
 This is particularly true of the aluminum nail. Wherever water, moisture, condensation, water-base paint or generally damp atmosphere is likely to reach, this nail is especially effective and money-saving. It is also useful in fastening certain building materials which attack certain metals other than aluminum, and is of course, essential for fastening aluminum roofing or siding where galvanic action otherwise would occur.

These are the logical conditions under which use of aluminum nails is suggested by experts, but general use of aluminum nails in the framing of a house, in flooring, or in interior panel trim is not recommended. For such protected applications the common nail is strong enough, durable enough and cheap enough.

But in all types of siding and almost all roofing, and especially in redwood, red cedar and asbestos, the aluminum nail pays a dividend of longer life, reduced maintenance and no rust. The appearance of finished wood siding with ugly rust stains, and therefore eliminates the need for frequent repainting or unsightly, rust-streaked siding. In general, aluminum's rust-proof characteristics make it especially valuable in roofing accessories where run-off water from metal roofing frequently requires expensive maintenance. Various types of aluminum roofing fixtures, flashing, ridge roll and gutters are available. In addition, aluminum roll valley, which comes packed in convenient rolls, is a handy item to have around the house work-shed. It may be used for anything from patching a rat hole to lining a laundry chute.

FENCING
 Aluminum chain link fencing is another aluminum product which has considerable merit for the rural handyman. Since it's rust-proof it never needs painting, — a slow,

tedious job required of other types of fencing. Its light weight makes it easy to erect, which prompts its use for children's play pens and yards, and for neighborhood tennis courts and baseball backstops.

Basic applications for aluminum are growing steadily. Aluminum clothes, can be left up permanently and cleaned easily by wiping with a damp rag. Often they're also used for grape arbors, flower trellises, television guy wire (strand-rod), and other decorative and utilitarian purposes.

In addition, aluminum also has a wide range of uses, also, from shutters, venetian blinds and louver shades to pots and pans and foil for cooking and preserving foods.

Q—How do I go about finishing raw knotty pine with white paint? I don't know what the finish is called, but you wipe off the paint.

A—The finish you describe is called "antiquing." Prepare the raw wood with two applications of commercial bleach, then apply one coat of gray glaze stain. Rub with No. 00 sandpaper when dry. Then apply a fluid paste of pure white lead, diluted with linseed oil, with a soft rag, wiping off so only traces are left. Allow to dry overnight. Surface with white shellac or with one coat of shellac as an undercoat for varnish.

U.S. Still Dabbles In Iran Battle

TEHRAN, Iran, (U.S. Ambassador Loy W. Henderson said today the United States stands ready to aid in settling the British-Iranian oil dispute—provided the settlement benefits both parties.

At his first news conference for the Iranian press, Henderson declared, "I am most hopeful that the current oil controversy between Iran and Britain can eventually be settled in a spirit of good will and in such a manner as to benefit both parties, strengthen unity and promote the welfare of the whole free world."

Soap Cottons With Caution

"Just any soap" won't do when washing cottons, says Mary Beth Minden, extension home management specialist at Oregon State college.

She points out that just as there are both mild and strong soaps for use on different materials, synthetic detergents also may be mild or "built" by adding alkalines. Homemakers can tell by the labels whether a detergent is mild or has this extra alkalinity.

The type of cotton should determine which to use. For fine fabrics and colors that may fade, use mild soaps or mild synthetic detergents whenever possible. For heavily soiled cottons, the "built" soaps or "built" synthetics are recommended.

In soft water, soaps and some "built" synthetics give best results. In hard water, "built" synthetics do the best job.

Either soap or synthetic will wash cleaner if hot instead of lukewarm water is used, providing the fabrics and dyes will stand it. Remove stains first, warns Miss Minden, for some are set permanently.

 When using soap, keep a good suds. With a synthetic, use only the amount recommended. Remember that some synthetics clean with out sudsing. No high-sudsing detergents should be used in automatic washers, the specialist cautions.
