

## Mother Saves Children, Dies

NEW YORK, (AP)—One by one, a Brooklyn mother dropped four of her children three stories into a blanket held by neighbors Tuesday as fire destroyed their apartment building.

Then she collapsed and died in the flames before help could reach her.

Mrs. Irma Randall, 35-year-old Negro, shouted to passersby when she discovered the fire. Then she calmly tossed one child, followed by the children, aged 10 months to eight years.

But the blanket was too flimsy for her to risk a jump, and the flames kept a neighbor from reaching her. Firemen arrived with a ladder too late.

Only one of her children was hurt.

Meanwhile, in two other fires in the nation, seven small children and a mother died yesterday.

An explosion and fire at a farm house near Atlanta, Neb., took the lives of Mrs. Walter Leach and her four children, aged two to six. In Exmore, Va., a babysitter went to a store and left three Negro children—Barbara Ann, Burdette and Peggy Jean Christian—locked in their home. The young-est, aged seven months to three years, died in a fire that broke out just as the babysitter, Margaret Smith, 17, arrived at the store.

## Child Saved By First Aid

PORTLAND, (AP)—The 16-month-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude Hockley is alive today because Mrs. Hockley took a Red Cross first aid course last winter.

This is her story: Mrs. Hockley was working in the kitchen when she noticed that the boy had disappeared from his play area in the yard Monday. She rushed outside to a neighbor's lawn pool.

"I always look there first," she said.

There she found the boy, submerged in water except for his legs. She dragged him out and began artificial respiration as she had learned it in her Red Cross first aid course.

After a few minutes the boy began breathing. He was rushed to a Portland hospital.

Doctors are watching for pneumonia though. They also are watching for symptoms of a brain injury which might be caused by lack of oxygen.

No ill effects are apparent, though.

## Peron Plans For Election

BUENOS AIRES, (AP)—The Argentine congress is expected to approve quickly a bill permitting president Juan D. Peron to step out of office until after the November 11 elections.

Peron is seeking another six-year term in the presidency.

He sent a telegram message to congress yesterday, calling it into session on Thursday to name an acting president. He said he did not want to preside over the elections while being a candidate.

Peron also asked the lawmakers to invite Latin American labor leaders and newspapermen to observe the elections and make sure of their "fairness."

The president's Peronista party and its powerful ally, the CGT labor organization, will stage a mass meeting October 17 to honor Senora Peron for her decision against accepting the party's vice presidential candidacy.

Both Peron and his wife are expected to speak at the rally. It will be her first public appearance since she fell seriously ill last month with acute anemia.

## New Power Curbs Loom

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The national production authority has warned the aluminum industry to expect another power cutback in the event of a new dry spell in the Pacific Northwest.

The agency notified the Aluminum Company of America, Reynolds metals and Kaiser Aluminum Corp. yesterday the power may be interrupted again late in October unless rainfall continues in the Northwest.

The NPA outlined a tentative procedure for dealing with power shortage, should new ones develop.

Interruptible power will be required, the agency said, unless essential lighting will be turned off in a brownout, and power deliveries homes will be cut in the latter case on a voluntary basis.

The NPA also disclosed plans to divert aluminum now being delivered into the defense stockpile to industry to make up the 4,800,000 pounds lost in September power shortages in the Northwest and in North Carolina.

## Chris Gets Here Early

NEW YORK, (AP)—Christopher Columbus discovered America today, two days ahead of time.

The history books say he got here October 12.

But the modern Columbus, a 26-year-old Spanish duke and naval lieutenant, beat the traditional landing date.

A direct descendant and namesake of the man who first sailed to this country in 1492, he's on his way to Washington to be guest of the Spanish embassy at its celebration Friday of the discovery of America.

It was his first trip here, and some Indians (from Arizona) were out to offer him tobacco (tallor-mades), just like they did his ancestor.

The plane flight from Madrid took 21 hours, which is probably what helped put him ahead of the schedule of the original Columbus, who made it in 70 days on the ship Santa Maria.

And this time, there were no mutinies by the crew.
