

# Balking Buyers Cause Some Cuts in Meat Prices

Retail prices of a few prime and choice grade beef cuts, particularly steaks, dropped as much as 13 cents a pound this week in scattered markets as customers balked at paying ceiling prices. But reductions of any kind were far in the minority. Most beef and pork prices held at the same levels established after higher ceilings were granted recently. Veal, lamb and chicken prices also were generally steady.

Top grade large eggs were unchanged to six cents a dozen higher and thrifty shoppers in many sections found it to their advantage to buy pullet eggs, cheaper on a pound for pound basis. Potatoes, onions, pears and dwindling supplies of melons were higher this week in most produce markets. Apples turned upward, too, reflecting increased demand attributed to cooler weather and the apple industry's October promotion campaign. Heavier supplies of tomatoes,

carrots, cauliflower, and most citrus fruits caused their prices to edge off slightly. The agriculture department noted that hog prices have sagged almost 15 percent since mid-summer and probably will go even lower during the rest of the year as marketing increases seasonally. More cattle has been coming to market in recent weeks but the larger supplies have been bought chiefly by cornbelt feeders to be fattened further on grain feed.

Researchers of American Can Co. with a bow to Columbus Day tomorrow, listed corn, potatoes, tomatoes, snap beans, lima beans, squash and pumpkin among the "truly all-American foods." They said that corn, tomatoes, snap beans and lima beans were processed in about 2,000,000 (B) containers last year and had a value of more than \$120,000,000. Pineapples, avocados and cranberries also were listed as foods unknown to Europeans before Columbus, and the colonizers who followed him, encountered them in the Americas.
