Farmer, Wife Killed by Bull

DURANGO, Ia., (AP)—A bull, enraged when his farmer owner started driving cows to the barn for milking, killed both the farmer and his wife yesterday.

Dead were Mike Magerus, 66, and his wife, Anna, 62, who lived on a farm near this eastern Iowa hamlet of about 50 persons. They were trampled and gored by the bull.

The bull was shot and killed by three Durango men—Henry Butlett, Herman Tappe and William Haber-korn. Butlett operates a butcher shop and grocery store in Durango. He said it took 38 shots from .22 caliber rifles to kill the bull.

Sheriff Leo J. Martin said Magerus went to get the cows, and when he did not return his wife went after him. Their bodies were found by a son, Elroy, 23, who also went to the pasture when his mother failed to come back to the house.

Red Jungle Queen Taken

BOMBAY India (AP)—Police today arrested a Communist jungle queen who has been wanted for five years for waging a bow-and-arrow war against the state.

She is Godavaribal Parulekar nicknamed "goda Rani" (Queen Goda) who allegedly has been organizing a new Red uprising among timber cutting tribesmen in the jungles outside Bombay. The last one was put down in 1947.

The queen was trapped in a suburban house with seven other Reds and a cart-load of terrorist literature.

Her "subjects" fought police in 1947 with bows and arrows but were overwhelmed.

Famed Fire Remembered

Twenty-five years ago tomorrow, October 16, 1926, Southern Oregon's most famous hotel, the White Pelican was completely destroyed by fire here. Loss was estimated at \$400,000 and the fire removed one of the most colorful hotels in the entire West.

The four-story brick building, completed in 1912 was known from coast to coast for its fabulous service. Balsiger Motor Co. now occupies the site.

Owners were the Fleischhacker interests, San Francisco and the Klamath Development Co. T. P. Henderson was the local representative for Fleischhacker and Hope Millbourne was manager.

The fire started apparently from a leaking ammonia pipe in the basement and in half an hour after the first small explosion, flames were licking at the roof. Practically the entire population of the town turned out for the fire.

Two hundred guests found accommodations in other hotels here.

Famed Circus 'Flyer' Dies

LONG BEACH Calif. (AP)—The last of the "Flying Codonas" is dead.

Atelardo (Lalo) Codona, 55, member of the famous but ill-fated and in a sleeping car provided by the Southern Pacific.

The Willard, Anchor and Young hotels were under construction. Two German roller skaters saved from the fire that day later perished a few years later in flames that destroyed the widely-known Harriman lodge a log structure built in the late 80's by the railroad magnate, E. H. Harriman on the west side of Upper Klamath lake.

Once there were four: Lillian Leitzel, Alfredo Codona, Vera Bruce and Lalo.

The series of tragedies started in 1930. Lillian Leitzel fell from a trapeze in Copenhagen. Three years later Alfredo fell during a show in New York. He was hurt badly and never returned to his work. In 1937 Alfredo once married to Lillian shot and killed Vera his second wife. Then he killed himself.

Five months later in Paris Lalo fell. He lived but never went back to the circus. Lalo opened an auto-

mobile repair shop here and ran it until he died.

Cuba Periled By Hurricane

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—A small but "extremely dangerous" hurricane neared Cuba today as warning flags fluttered along the lower southern coast of Florida.

From Miami, site of the American Legion's 33rd national convention opening today, southward through the keys to the Western Bahamas an alert has been posted. Hurricane precautions were ordered in Western Cuba, especially in the Havana, Matanzas and Santa Clara provinces.

At 5 a.m. today the weather bureau reported the storm was centered about 120 miles south-southwest of Havana and 330 miles south-southwest of Miami.
