Huskies Underdog To Illini

NEW YORK, (AP)—Most of the nation's top-ranking college football teams flaunt their biceps before neighborhood audiences tomorrow, with the headline attraction sending California against Southern California at Berkeley.

The Golden Bears of California, No. 1 nationally and with a string of 38 straight regular season victories, rule a two-touchdown favorite over a solid Trojan eleven rated No. 11 in the Associated Press poll.

The Bears have averaged 41 1/2 points a game in smashing past Santa Clara, Penn. Minnesota and Washington State. Southern Cal has won four games and lost only an informal skirmish with Camp Pendleton.

Of the other teams in the Top Ten, Tennessee, Texas A&M, Maryland and Baylor also appear to have a busy afternoon ahead of them, although all are favored by from 13 to 14 1/2 points.

TRADITIONAL Tennessee's thick-thighed young men, second in the National ratings, defend their unblemished record against three-beaten Alabama at Birmingham, Ala. The Crimson Tide's inferior record can't be taken too much into account since this is a traditional battle in which they pile up the injured like stove wood.

Tradition also puts added teeth into the fray at College Park, Md., where Maryland and North Carolina, longtime antagonists of the southern conference, Maryland, seventh-ranked, has shown tremendous power in winning three games but Terrapin Coach Jim Tatum, a former North Carolina guard, generally has trouble with his alma mater.

TEXAS A&M, No. 6, one of the leading favorites for Southwest conference honors, plays twice-beaten Texas Christian at Fort Worth while Baylor, No. 10, has a tough test at Waco against Texas Tech, 23-19 conqueror of TCU last week.

Two of the current gridiron elite—third-ranked Michigan State and eighth-ranked Illinois—take to the road.

Michigan State journeys to State College, Pa., where it rules a 14-point favorite over a Penn State team that has won two and lost one in three games.

Illinois invades Seattle for a game with rebounding Washington. The Illini are 5 1/2 point picks.

Texas goes after its fifth straight victory in a Southwest conference tilt with Arkansas at Fayetteville, Ark. The fourth-ranked Longhorns are an eight-point choice.

WIN STREAK Georgia Tech, No. 5, is host to Auburn, Princeton, No. 9, with the longest winning streak now going in major ranks.

Two of the Pacific Coast's fine independent clubs come east to impress Eastern experts.

The college of the Pacific, winner of its first four games, takes on Boston University tonight. San Francisco, also unbeaten and owning an outstanding back in Ollie Matson, plays Fordham at New York.

Notre Dame, side-tracked last week by Southern Methodist, is a 13 1/2 point favorite over Pittsburgh at Pittsburgh. SMU, meanwhile, meets Rice in a night game at Dallas.

Ten Preps Unbeaten; Tornado, GP Meet

Just one month remains before Oregon high school teams go into their championship playoffs, and only 10 class A teams still are undefeated and untied.

All 10 go into action this weekend. All 10 are expected to emerge unscathed.

The most notable is Grants Pass, No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for the past month. After piling up five straight non-counting victories this season, Grants Pass at last goes into district competition.

IN-AND-OUTER The opponent will be Medford, an in-and-out performer this season. If Medford happens to have one of its better nights, the game might be close. But the game will be on Grants Pass' home field, and Grants Pass, undefeated in 16 straight games, will be the favorite.

Marshallfield, No. 3 in the latest poll and victor in five straight games, will take on unbeaten but one-tied Reedsport in a non-district game at Reedsport.

Eugene, defeated only by Medford, will be host to Albany in a game that does not count in district standings but will be important to the Big Six league race. Eugene was No. 9 in the latest poll.

TOP GAMES Two top-notch games are offered in Portland, Lincoln, the No. 10 team in the state and the current leader of the Portland race, will tackle Grant, the state's No. 6 team. Roosevelt, the No. 2 team in the state, will play Washington Hillsboro, winner of five straight games and No. 5 in the latest poll.

Astoria, also winner of five straight, is expected to coast to a victory over Seaside. Astoria is the state's No. 4 team.

Another team with five straight wins, Milton-Freewater, expects to find things easy against Hermiston in a district game. Milton-Freewater is the state's No. 7 team.

SEEK SIXTH The No. 8 team, Prineville, will journey to Lakeview, expected to gain a sixth straight victory of the season.

The other undefeated and untied teams are Rainier, North Marion, Toledo and University High of Eugene. Rainier is expected to win with ease from Scappoose, Toledo to defeat Siuslaw, North Marion to down Sherwood. University won its fifth straight by swamping Willamette of Eugene last night, 53-0. Oregon City, unbeaten but tied, is favored over Milwaukie.

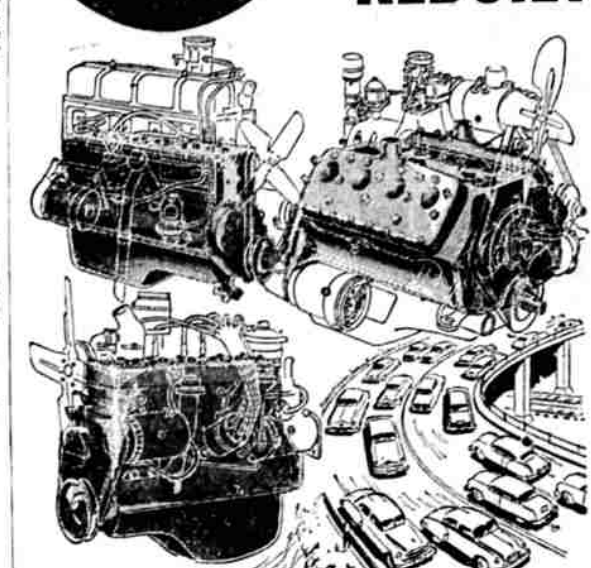
Phil Cavarretta, manager of the Chicago Cubs, broke in with the Cubs as a first baseman in 1934 at the age of 18.

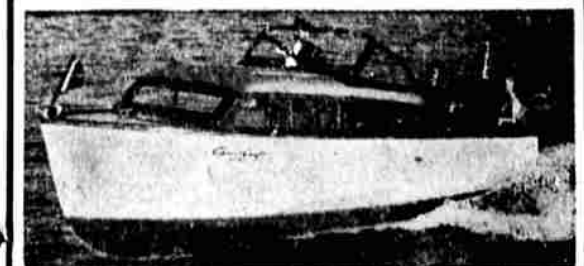
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
