## 22 Arrested In G.I. Fraud

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The FBI has announced the arrest of 22 persons on charges of fraud against the government in connection with the G.I. educational program.

Fourteen arrests were made in Miami, two in Detroit, one in Dayton, O., two in New York City and three in the Newark, N.J. area.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover identified those arrested as employees, officials, and owners of five vocational schools, including the Berlitz School of Languages of America Inc., at Miami.

Hoover said the alleged frauds total more than \$350,000.

In the past 10 months, he added, FBI investigations have resulted in the arrest of more than 300 persons charged with similar frauds totaling close to \$1,000,000 (M).

Under the G.I. plan, the government foots the bill for a veterans tuition and other school expenses. Hoover said the alleged frauds involved in today's arrests include faked records of student enrollment and attendance.

"Attendance records for G.I. students were certified by forged names of legitimate teachers, relatives, acquaintances and neighbors to reflect these persons taught the veterans whereas no instruction was given," Hoover said telling of the Miami operations.

## Irrigation Aid From McNary?

PORTLAND, (AP)—McNary dam considered a navigation and power project—may also provide some irrigation, a bureau of reclamation report said Wednesday.

The prospects are not too encouraging for large-scale irrigation, the bureau said, but more studies will be made.

The report said some 33,000 acres in a one-mile strip on either side of the Columbia river could be irrigated with only a small amount of pumping. Other areas, however, would require more pumping.

To irrigate 66,000 acres in the Horse Heaven area of Washington, west of the dam, a pump lift of 700 feet would be required. Another 61,200 acres could be irrigated with a lift of 450 feet.

A 700-foot lift also would be needed to irrigate 36,700 acres near the Columbia, east of the Hermiston and Stanfield irrigation districts and north of Stage gulch.

Land west of the manilla river could be reached better by water from the projected John Day dam. Water from McNary would have to flow through a long canal and siphon to reach the area. East of the Umatilla river, the cost could not be cut below that of the present privately developed Brown ditch.

A report expected in 1953 will consider 227,000 acres near the John Day project.

## Many Seek State Bonus

Probably around 3500 Klamath county veterans of the last war have applied for the state veterans bonus which might not be paid for a long time.

Ted Case, veterans service officer, said it is impossible right now to pin down the exact figure of bonus applications, because the blanks have been filled out by the various veterans organizations and in every town in the county as well as in his office.

But the state sent down 5700 blanks for the county, and more than half of them have been used.

The \$600 maximum bonus was voted last November at the general election, but no provision was made to raise the money.

Since that time various alleys of possible revenue have been explored and discarded, and now a branch of the federal government has termed the bonus inflationary. Money lenders won't bid on state bonds for it.

But applications here are still being made out daily, Case said. The county clerk's office likewise has been busy with the bonus. Since certified copies of military service discharges must go in with the applications, the office has made certified photostats of about 1400 discharges since last May, free of charge.

## Fires Blamed On Hunters

MOUNT SHASTA—Since the beginning of hunting season, careless hunters have caused 10 fires, three of which were caused by abandoned campfires and seven were caused by careless smokers. The largest fire burned six acres before it was controlled.

The rainfall during the past two weeks has not been of enough intensity to bring the fire season to a close. The rains did lessen the danger to a point where most of the lookouts and fire crews were terminated or placed on project work.

To date, the 1951 season total shows that the Shasta forest had to combat a total of 199 fires. Lightning caused 126 and 73 were man-caused. The breakdown of the man-caused fires shows that 19 were railroad caused, seven by campfires, 32 by smokers, five by debris-burning, one by incendiary and nine from miscellaneous cause.

The total burned area is 1723 acres, of which 669 acres is national forest, 1003 acres private land within the Shasta forest boundary and 51 acres of private land outside of the forest boundary but within the Shasta forest protection area.

Two hunters, Claude W. Bolan of Dunsmuir, and Dennis W. Hopkins of Redwood City, were apprehended and cited to appear in the Squaw Valley justice court at McCloud, for leaving campfires unattended. Both persons pled guilty to the charges and Justice of the Peace Hanson fined each \$25.00 for leaving a campfire.

With the last days of hunting season upon us, it is well to remember that a campfire must be chaperoned. It can't be left to go out by itself. If you build a campfire, be sure that it is dead out before you leave it. If you smoke, follow the simple rules of smoking and you can be sure that your smoke will not cause a fire.
