Five Killed As Plane Hits

NASSAU, Bahamas, (AP)—Five of the nine persons aboard a U. S. air force plane from the Cocoa, Fla., guided missile base were killed last night in a crash off Nassau.

Four others were saved by air-sea rescue units and were brought to Nassau.

An officer at the Cocoa base said the plane had taken off from Nassau enroute to Mayaguana island, where a guided missile tracking station is being built.

Only one body was recovered last night. It was identified as that of the pilot, Capt. Irving David Shapiro, San Francisco.

The four rescued were identified as Staff Sgt. Morris L. Dove (thometown unavailable), shock; Sgt. Edward H. Burkhardt North Hollywood, Calif., shock and slight eye; and Cpl. James H. Price, Manitou Beach, Mich., slight cuts.

Red Neckpiece Follows Line

BERLIN, (AP)—A capitalistic gadget may help keep Communists in line—the party line.

A private manufacturer in East Germany has come up with a plastic bag in which 1,000,000 East German Communists in the future are to carry their party cards—on a string around their necks.

The bag was approved by the Communist central committee after a series of troublesome incidents over lost cards. Many cards had been used to collect autographs and others had been stolen from briefcases and handbags—despite a regulation that the card must be kept on the person at all times. They can't miss now.

Woman Glad Of Mistake

SEATTLE, (AP)—Mrs. John Morgan is mighty happy today that she was so wrong.

Mrs. Morgan, 23, is the former Miss Lee Young Soon of Seoul, Korea, and is the first Korean war bride to come to the United States. She was wrong about the reception she would get in her strange new land.

"I was afraid the American people wouldn't like me," she confessed as she landed here yesterday afternoon with her husband, Sgt. John Morgan, 23, Bremerton, Wash. And then she signed happily and said, "I'm convinced now I was wrong."

She was warmly greeted by her new parents-in-law, local officials and hundreds of persons who gathered to welcome 780 servicemen and women who returned from the Orient aboard the transport Gen. M. M. Patrick.

Morgan met his bride-to-be before the Korean war broke out when he was stationed at Pohang and she was a telephone supervisor.

Greek Commie Trials Start

ATHENS, Greece, (AP)—One hundred persons charged with attempting to revive Greece's Communist underground went on trial today before a special military tribunal in Athens.

Key defendant is Niko Beloyannis, who played a major role in the Peloponnesus during the guerrilla war in 1949. He served then as a senior officer in the Communist army.

Beloyannis is accused of having inspired the wholesale massacre in the Southern Peloponnesus during the early stage of the conflict.

Pakistan's New Government Takes Over; Premier Said Friend of U.S.

KARACHI, Pakistan, (AP)—Pakistan's new government—which officially starts functioning today—is expected to make little change in the late Prime Minister Liaquat Ali Khan's policies at home and abroad.

People who know Liaquat's successor, former Gov. Gen. Khwaja Nazimuddin, predict he will stick close to the national program of reform and growth laid down by his predecessor.

Liaquat, first prime minister of the four-year-old Moslem nation, was shot to death Tuesday by a fanatic Afghan.

U.S. VIEW
Toward the United States, Nazimuddin likely will follow Liaquat's example of friendliness. One official who knows him well said the new prime minister "certainly understands and probably appreciates the position the United States holds in the world today."

In his handling of relations with neighboring India—the dispute over Kashmir and other conflicts his associates expect Nazimuddin to be as firm as the man who preceded him. But not necessarily more firm, they quickly added.

The short, stocky Nazimuddin already has gained political stature among his people by his willingness to step down, in effect, from his post as governor general to become prime minister.

As he and the new administration took over today, the shocked capital slowly returned to normal.

Bands of teenage youths swarmed through Karachi's streets yesterday threatening to smash stores which stayed open in violation of the nation's two-day formal mourning period. But by nightfall many of the shops were open and the city's traffic was approaching its usual noisy bustle. Diplomatic observers said Liaquat's death could easily have

touched off a great Asian explosion of tribal and national warring. They credited Nazimuddin with prompt action to prevent it.
By asking King George to release him from his post as governor general to take over leadership of the cabinet, they said, he effectively halted any attempt by factional leaders to seize the government. His quick action united the whole country in sup-

port of his new administration.
One of the problems facing his cabinet is Pakistan's feud with Afghanistan, the wild, hill country lying between Pakistan and Russia.
Observers in Karachi forecast

Nazimuddin would continue Liaquat's "tolerant" attitude toward the Afghans. The fact that Liaquat's slayer was an Afghan national was not expected to heat the differences between the two nations.

They are feuding over Afghanistan's sponsorship of tribal efforts to carve a new tribal state from Pakistan's Northwest province.

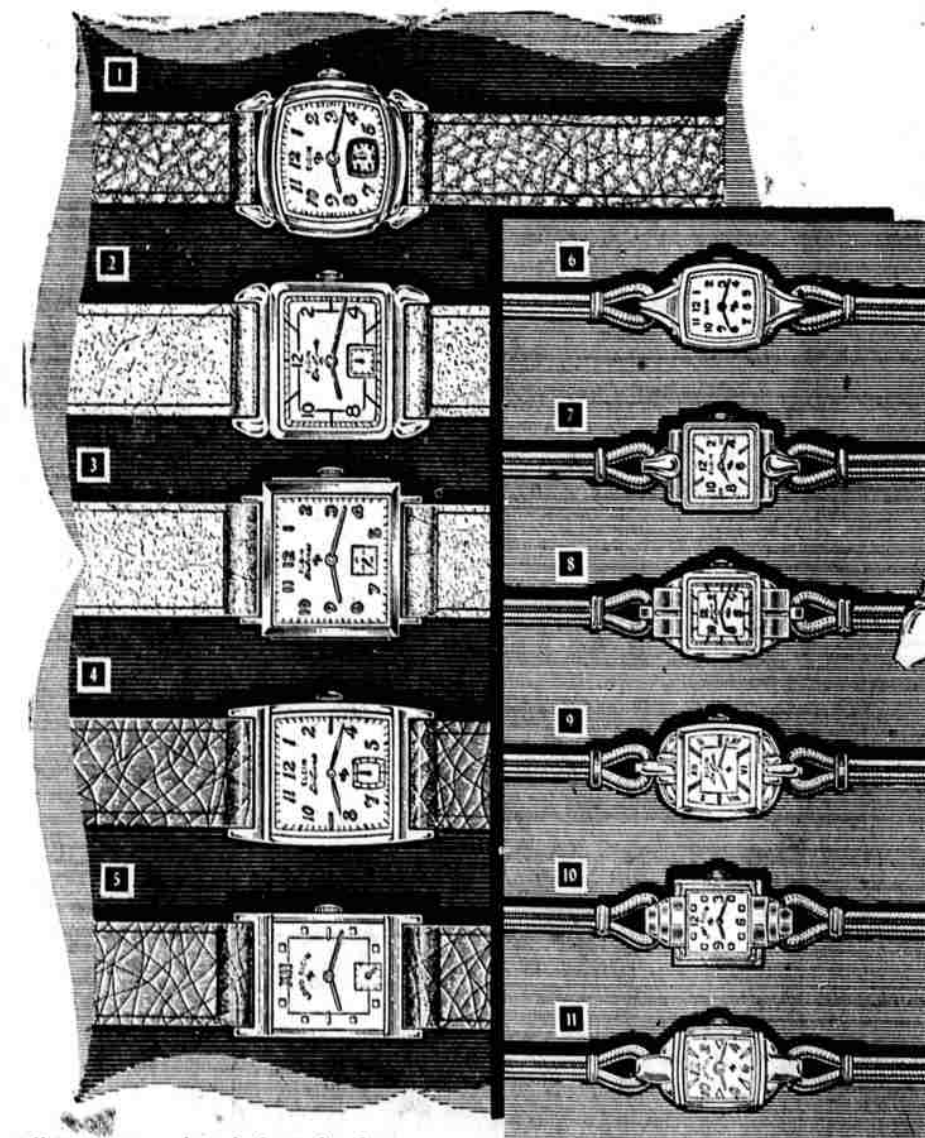
