

HILL TIRES OF BEEFS AGAINST USC

Waldorf Has No Excuses

LOS ANGELES, (AP)—It's getting so the Southern California Trojans can't win a football game without being accused of skulduggery and malice aforethought.

Whatever tactics were employed on the field of bloodshed in last Saturday's 21-14 upset over California, however, Coach Pappy Waldorf now agrees that USC beat his Bears fair and square.

California rooters had raised cries of outrage over what they termed a USC plot to main Cal's star fullback, Johnny Olszewski.

The week before, it had been Oregon State rooters who were complaining over the way USC won. And the week before that, Washington had come in with a beef similar to California's.

HILL FIRES

"I am getting sick and tired of the things that seem to be said after every one of our games," fumed Trojan Coach Jess Hill yesterday before the Southern California football writers meeting.

"We have no alibis, no complaints, and no criticism of the officiating," Coach Waldorf told the Northern California writers. He said he could find no evidence of premeditated rough play.

Thus the quieting aftermath of the weekend's number one unhorsing, the consensus seemed to be this:

INNOCENT

Trojan linebacker Pat Cannamela is as innocent of any wrongdoing as a woodland nymph; he merely is unaware of his own brute strength; and the best way to keep from being killed by him is to step on one side.

It was Cannamela's tackle that put Olszewski out of business most of the afternoon, and probably, for two weeks more as well.

Hill described the felling of Olszewski as "one of the finest and cleanest tackles I have ever seen."

"The movies show that Cannamela slashed into Olszewski from the side," concurred Waldorf in San Francisco. "The pictures show no deliberate intention to twist Olszewski's leg."

ONE OF BEST

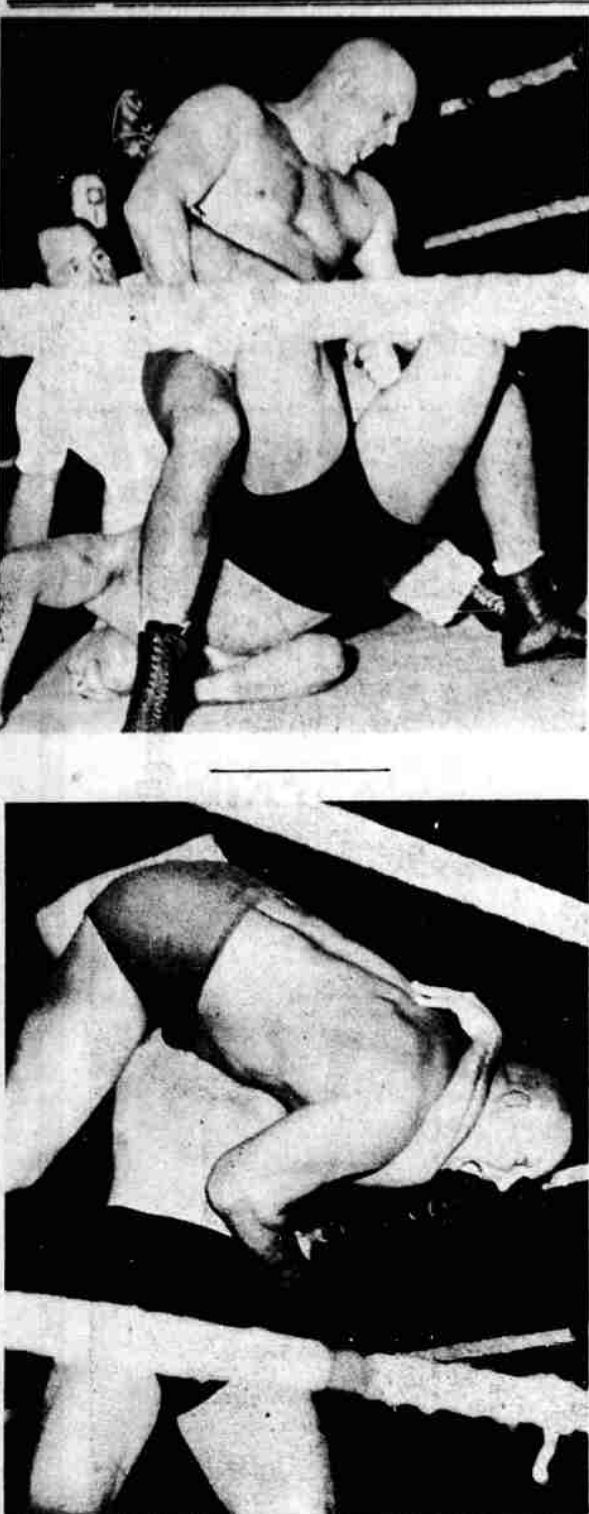
The California headman complimented USC as "one of the best teams I have seen in some years," adding:

"Its defensive unit is a sturdy one. On the subject of whether USC used illegal tactics, I can say we have no feeling there was any organized effort to put key California men out of commission."

That would appear to close the matter except for one factor. The Trojans have five more games on their schedule, the most imminent being Texas Christian here next Saturday.

That more rhubarbs may be forthcoming is indicated by Hill's declaration that he has no intention of changing USC's style of play. He said he hopes his boys "play just as rough the rest of the season."

Bears Skid to Ninth; Trojans Move to 6th

NEW YORK, (AP)—The University of Tennessee, rated as the nation's No. 1 college football team before the season opened, finally made the grade today in the fourth weekly Associated Press poll. California, last week's top team, dropped to the No. 9 spot.

The Volunteers of Gen. Bob Neyland, who clouted Alabama 27-13 Saturday, received a whopping total of 70 first-place votes out of 161 cast by the nation's sports writers and sportscasters to take over the No. 1 ranking.

MOVE UP

This gave Tennessee a total of 1354 points—a comfortable margin over Michigan State, the No. 2 team, with 1202 points. Michigan State, a 32-21 winner over Penn State had 28 first-place votes, and moved up from a third place ranking a week ago.

The rough weekend for several top-ranking teams caused some juggling of the standings among the top 10, but only Texas A&M dropped out of the select group. The Aggies skidded from No. 6 last week to No. 16, after being upset by Texas Christian, 20-14.

BIGGEST JUMP

Southern California's Trojans, who hung a 21-14 defeat on the California Bears, made the biggest jump in the ratings—from eleventh a week ago to the No. 6 place vacated by the Texas Aggies.

Georgia Tech, who took over the Southeastern conference lead by defeating Auburn, 27-7, advanced from fifth place to third. The Tech Yellowjackets were the only other team besides Tennessee and Michigan State to get more than 1000 points. Georgia Tech had 1022.

Illinois, which invaded the far west to demonstrate its power with a 27-20 victory over Washington, moved all the way from eighth place to No. 4 rank.
