## Troops Stalk Red Killers

**SINGAPORE, (U—)** Gurkha soldiers fought their way in heavy tropical rains through the dense jungles of central Malaya today, close on the trail of Communist guerrillas believed responsible for the killing of British High Commissioner Sir Henry Gurney.

The force of nearly 2000 troops guns, rifles and grenades—from the area of Pahang state in which the hunt was underway.

The Gurkhas found new camps abandoned by the fleeing Reds. They now appeared to have only a three-hour lead on their pursuers. Royal air force planes bombed and strafed suspected Red flight routes of the "Malayan republic liberation army."

Big rewards were offered for their capture.

Lt. Col. A. K. Crookshank di-

recting the search for Sir Henry's killers, said the terrorists were led by two Chinese, Kan Min and Chin Loy. He identified them as leaders of the 10th and 24th companies.

Gurney was slain October 6 by guerrillas who ambushed a convoy in which he and his wife were travelling to a hill resort north of Kuala Lumpur. Mrs. Gurney escaped injury.
