Oregon Official Stresses Wildlife Resources' Value

There's no price tag on the value of Oregon's wildlife resources, Asst. Game Director Clark B. Walsh told members of the Klamath Falls Kiwanis club at its regular luncheon yesterday in the Willard, and the state game commission and its subsequent divisions are responsible for those resources.

However, the value is there, Walsh said. He noted that an estimated 175,000 deer hunters were in Oregon forests during this year's three-week season, and guesses that more than 5,000,000 (5M) pounds of meat was taken home to lockers. Added to that, he said, another 20,000 to 25,000 elk hunters are taking to the woods this week, and in one of the 1000 Oregon lakes stocked with trout, a count of 27,000 anglers was compiled this year.

Walsh explained to the more than 100 Kiwanians present the inner-workings of the game commission and its divisions, and described the means by which the commission is attempting to maintain the state's wildlife resource. "A big problem," he said, "is

balancing wildlife with increasing industry and population. We must try to give the wildlife the best deal possible without slowing progress."

The keys to the future of our wildlife, Walsh said, are a good game commission, which we have; a good game director, which we have; a solid program; and public support through public understanding.

Walsh was introduced by Elmer Balsiger, a member of the state game commission from Klamath Falls.
