Seattle Symphony Leader Fired; Love Life Blamed

SEATTLE, (AP) — Manuel Rosenthal, Seattle symphony orchestra conductor who made the headlines but not the headlines, was out of a job today.

At least, so far as the board of directors of the symphony is concerned, the peppy little Frenchman who came here in 1949 has been disengaged from his \$15,000 a year job. Rosenthal's attorney apparently believes otherwise and says he intends to hold the board to its two-year contract.

Dismissal. The diminutive, 47-year-old conductor was fired yesterday afternoon while a U.S. immigration board in New York was investigating the problems that put Rosenthal in a bad light here.

Meat Premium Plan Killed

WASHINGTON, (AP) — The army will not pay premium prices for beef, Defense Mobilizer Charles E. Wilson said last night.

Wilson's statement followed reports that department of agriculture officials had been discussing premium price payments as a possible means of getting more beef for the armed services. They have not been able to get all they need in recent weeks.

Wilson said he was speaking for the agriculture department, the office of price stabilization and his own office in stating that "there is no intention to take such a proposal under consideration."

Forest Road Contract Let

LAKEVIEW.—A contract to build the first six miles of a forest access road to tap about 800,000,000 board feet of timber in the Thomas creek block of the Fremont national forest has been let by the bureau of public roads to J. W. Briggs, Toledo, Ore., contractor.

This will be the first such road to be constructed on the Fremont. Briggs began moving equipment here Thursday and the contract calls for completion of this first leg in June, 1952. L. P. Huftey, resident engineer in charge of the project for the bureau of public roads, is already here with a crew of eight men.

Briggs' contract calls for construction of 6.16 miles of road from the county road south of the Plume Hotchkiss ranch up Thomas creek through the Thomas creek gorge. The road is to be 28 feet wide from shoulder to shoulder and it is to have a crushed rock base one foot deep. The Briggs bid was \$162,856 for this first piece of road. The next six mile leg would put the road to Cox flat from where additional operators as they buy timber in the Thomas creek block, the construction to be made part of the contract for sale of the timber. The money used on this road is a part of the congressional allocation to the forest service for access roads but is turned over to the bureau of public roads for administration and the road construction. The bureau made the survey in 1949.

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Eccentric Held As Stabber

GOETTINGEN, Germany. (AP) — Police today blamed an eccentric science fan for the stabbing of Prof. Otto Hahn, German atom expert and Nobel prize winner. The 72-year-old Hahn, who won the 1944 Nobel chemistry prize, was slightly wounded in the shoulder when attacked Wednesday night. Josef Kastner, 29, who turned himself in as the assailant, sent Hahn an incoherent letter from his jail cell declaring the professor had led him "without any remedy, into antagonism."

LOS ANGELES, (AP) — Actress Jocelyn Court's dislike for John Button's great dane dog was reciprocated—painfully. "The dog watched me with a mean expression when I joined a group at a house party," she told newsmen after her \$50,000 damage suit against Button had been settled out of court. "I said, 'don't look at me that way,' and the dog bit me," she added. She declined to disclose settlement terms.
