Child Tells Of Torture

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP)—She struck a match and held it to my arm to teach us not to do it no more.

Thus did a 9-year-old boy relate in court yesterday how an over-crowded religious school called "God's Orphanage" burned his hand to punish him for playing with fire.

"I was trying to get my hand away and I was crying," the boy, Raymond Charles Turner, testified. "My arm was red."

The youngster told his story at the preliminary hearing of Mrs. Julia Elizabeth Ward, 46, and Mrs. Carolyn Jane Munger, 25. The women were ordered to face superior court trial November 2 on three charges of felonious assault and inflicting corporal injury on a child.

Young Raymond said Mrs. Ward, known at the institution as "Sister Ward," burned his wrist while Mrs. Munger held him. He said he watched the same punishment being administered to two 8-year-olds, Leonard Vuckan and Richard Earl Carpenter.

"Mrs. Ward then told us to get on our knees and pray and to ask God to help us," the Turner boy said, adding: "We all prayed to God for the burns to heal."

Mrs. Ward is the wife of the Rev. Tilford Ward, head of the institution and an ordained minister of the Assembly of God church. His school is in no way connected with the church, however.

Justice of the Peace John Shea ordered bail for the two women continued at \$1000 each.

SEATTLE (AP)—The arms of Morpheus outwrestled those of his bride-to-be, so a slumbering young sailor out of San Diego lost camp had to take the long way around by way of Chicago—to get married in Ketchikan.

Pan American World Airways told the story.

The sailor, Alfred Berry, 20, boarded a United Air Lines plane in San Diego to start his 14-day leave. Then he went to sleep. When the plane got to Los Angeles, where he was to transfer to a northbound plane, Berry still slept.

The plane was two hours along the way to Chicago before a stewardess awakened him for his ticket. He handed it to her. It was a Panam ticket to Ketchikan.

So on he went to Chicago. Two hours after arriving there United put him on a San Francisco-bound plane with a gratis ticket marked "involuntary rerouting due to passenger being over-carried."

He arrived in Seattle last midnight and told the Seattle-Tacoma airport clerk about it. She sighed "I've heard enough"—then got him free accommodations in a downtown hotel for the night.

He caught a Panam plane at 8 a.m. today for Ketchikan.

There he is to be married to his childhood sweetheart, Nancy Collins, 17, of Ketchikan. He'll be two days late but—he guaranteed—wide awake.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Know what Juanita Hansen, movie serial queen of 38 years ago, is doing these days for a living?

She doesn't make \$1500 a week any more. But the 56-year-old blond says her life is much more serene than when she was starring with Tom Mix, Bill Hart and Jack Pickford.

What's she doing now? The Los Angeles Mirror has rediscovered her as a Southern Pacific train dispatcher in the small coastal city of Ventura, 70 miles northwest of here. She told the newspaper she works the graveyard shift—from midnight to 8 a.m.

Quite a contrast for an ex-Mack Bennett bathing beauty who commanded \$3000 a week for vaudeville appearances and who in 1928 reached musical comedy stardom on Broadway. She made an estimated \$1,000,000 in films between

1914 and 1922.

Her acting career ended abruptly in 1928 when she was horribly scalded in a shower bath. She spent a year in a hospital.

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Reno Horse Tickets Up

RENO, (AP)—Starting November 1, you'll have to dish out 10 percent more if you bet on a horse in Reno.

The gambling mecca's nine bookmakers, meeting together for the first time in Reno history, agreed last night to pass the federal government's new 10 percent tax on betting on to the customer.

In other words, they said, if you buy a \$2 ticket you'll have to pay \$2.20 for it and so on.

Spokesmen for the nine said the plan will be given a 30 day trial beginning next Thursday when the new tax takes effect.

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Korean Vets Get Housing Aids

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Pres. Truman signed Friday a bill giving veterans of fighting in Korea most of the housing benefits extended to previous veterans.

Korean vets will get preference in low-rent and defense housing

projects, and be allowed lower down payments when they get an FHA housing loan.

But the bill does not confer GI home loans. The house veterans committee is considering a GI home loans bill for Korean veterans.

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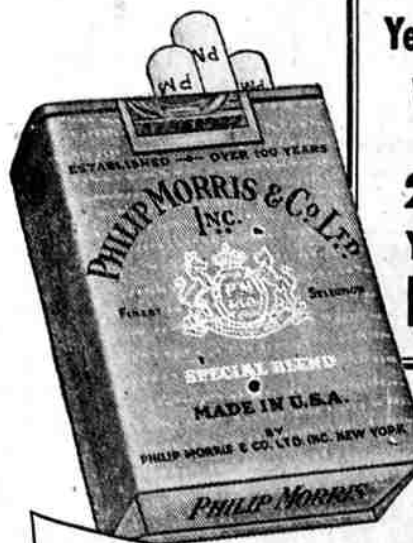
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
