Another Mine Victim Gone?

NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C. (AP)—British Columbia's legendary "Lost creek mine" appears to have claimed another victim.

A mounted police constable and a veteran guide have returned from a five-day search for Albert Gaspard, 60-year-old prospector who entered jungle-like wilderness 45 miles north of here 15 months ago to hunt for the fabled mine.

Constable John Dowsett and guide Stan Zepke said they found no trace of the prospector, nor even signs of a camp.

Gaspard was searching for a mine which, according to legend, an Indian named Slumach found 60 years ago. The Indian claimed the mine was on a creek lined with gold. Since then, 20 men have disappeared in the search for the creek.

YOUR NICKEL AND RAIL SERVICE

Like the old gray mare of yesteryear, the American nickel isn't what it used to be. The 5-cent piece doesn't pack much punch these days at the grocery store, the meat market and other places where you buy the things you need.

The nickel has meant less and less to Great Northern, too, in the past dozen years—especially for buying things the railway must have to provide transportation services.

Wages are a good example, for payroll is our biggest expense item. A nickel was worth 4 minutes of average employee service in 1939, but good for only 1 1/4 minutes as of July 1 this year.
