Vet's Mailbag
 Veterans disabled in military service anywhere in the world since the start of fighting in Korea are now eligible under a new law for vocational training on the same basis as world war two veterans, according to a recent announcement by the veterans administration.

The VA said that prior to passage of the new law, rehabilitation training was limited to veterans whose disabilities resulted from "armed conflict" or "extra hazardous" service, mainly those injured or disabled in Korea. The limitation barred many veterans from federally-sponsored training who had been disabled while serving in the United States or in non-combat zones.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK
 Q. Both of my sons, on whom I was dependent, died recently as the result of injuries incurred during world war two. Is it possible for me to receive death compensation payments on behalf of both?
 A. Yes. You must of course, file a claim with the VA, establishing dependency, and the VA must determine whether both deaths were service-connected.

 HOLLYWOOD, (AP)—Margaret Truman today won high praise from a fellow performer. Tallulah Bankhead, who predicts a "easy time" in show business for the president's daughter.

"She's a fine, talented girl," said Tallulah. "The 'dabbling' of radio hasn't—and that's right verb for Bankhead—upon the local scene this week to perform one of her 'big shows' in Hollywood."

"When Margaret first appeared on the show, we were a little afraid of how she would be, since she had never done that type of thing before. But we were enchanted with her she came through. She knew all her lines and she delivered them with the assurance of a veteran. And she was competing with such professionals as Fred Allen."
