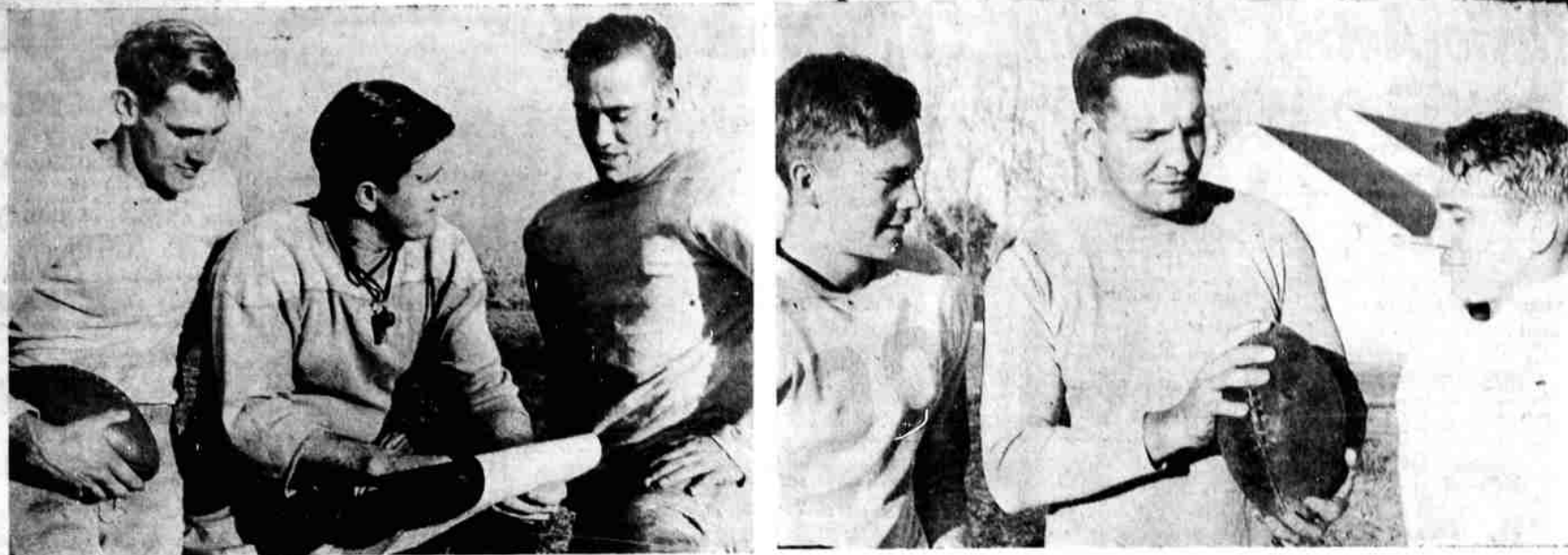

Henley, Malin Ready For Grid Title Fight

To one team—either Malin or Henley—will come a storybook finish to a successful 1951 football campaign tomorrow.

The Malin Mustangs and the Henley Hornets collide at Henley 1:30 p.m., in a pigskin fracas to decide the championship of the six-team loop.

The pre-season script had these two teams going into tomorrow's battle with undefeated records.

The script was followed all the way—and both go into the title tiff with 4-0 records.

The losers will shed gear until next year.

But the winner has more fruitful fields to conquer.

DISTRICT PLAY

The team finishing on the long end of the final score will square off with Phoenix, Jackson county champ, in a Dist. 5-B showdown.

From there, the winner throws its weight into the state B playoffs against the Dist. 6 winner.

Thus far, Drain (Dist. 4) is the only team assured of a state berth.

For Henley it's an all-out effort to return to the grid glory the Hornets held monotonously from 1943 through 1948.

COMEBACK

For Malin it's a rebound try from its championship 1949 campaign.

Merrill won the bauble last year but lost to Phoenix in the district game.

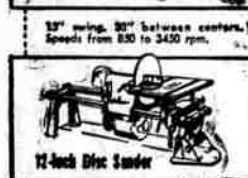
The first teams of both squads rate even, both boasting fast, touchdown-happy backfields and strong lines.

In addition to four wins over league opponents, Henley has defeated Lakeview, Tulelake and Rogue River, the latter runner-up to Phoenix in Jackson county.

Malin was hurt when Bonanza cancelled its game with the Mustangs. Actually, the Malin regulars haven't been pushed this season, winning its three conference games with ease, then warming up for tomorrow's showdown with 2-0 romp over the Klamath Union high school Wildcats.

Neither team is hampered by major injury. Both are primed for this Big Game.

Despite the pre-season dope sheet that gave the Hornets a slight edge with the Mustangs given a strong chance to kick over the dope bucket, the game tomorrow goes down as a strict toss-up.

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Dado Marino Keeps Title

HONOLULU, (AP)—Flyweight champion Dado Marino, the fighting grandfather, looked around today for a worthy challenger after soundly trouncing ex-champion Terry Allen of London in 15 rounds.

Marino weighed 112 and Allen 111½, for Dado's first defense last night of the title he won from Allen here 15 months ago.

The fight attracted 8812 fans who paid \$26,609.00.

Marino, 35-year-old father of five and grandfather of a baby girl, was awarded a unanimous decision over his cautious 27-year-old foe.

The Hawaiian outclassed the ex-champ in all departments and finished the long grind with a flourish.

It was a fast, unexciting fight with few sharp punches. Allen knocked Marino down in the first round with a left jab but the champ was on his feet before a count could start. Allen went down in the second for no count and slipped to the canvas on two other occasions. There was no count any time.
