### Neuner's List Not Accurate

PORTLAND, (AP)—Three Oregon district attorneys report they have found no slot machines at addresses listed for them by Atty. Gen. George Neuner.

The list was compiled from federal records showing tax stamps purchased for gambling devices. James A. Norman, Coquille, Coos county district attorney, said he had asked the Coos county sheriff to make surprise raids, but that no slot machines had been located.

Norman suggested that earlier newspaper reports of the listings may have resulted in the machines being removed before authorities could check.

E. E. Van Vactor, Klamath county district attorney, said he did not think there were any "one armed bandits" in his county. He said he would prosecute any cases brought to him.

Lincoln county district attorney, said state police and the sheriff had reported there were no slot machines in his county.

Neuner's list showed a total of 189 machines in Coos, Klamath and Lincoln counties.

### Charley Parr Said Missing

An aerial gunner in a B-29 heavy bomber, Cpl. Charley O. Parr, 21, in the 32nd Klamath Korean war casualty reported by the defense department.

According to a telegram received by the flyer's parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Parr, 3667 Flint, young Parr has been missing only since October 31. The telegram was received here the next day.

Mrs. Parr received her son's last letter October 22, written from his base in Okinawa. In a previous letter, written several weeks ago, Cpl. Parr reported he had completed 32 missions over the Korean combat zone, 500 miles from his base.

Cpl. Parr had received an air medal for services rendered in combat, and was in line for oak leaf clusters, his mother said.

Parr left the United States last Easter, flew to Hawaii, Japan and Guam before finally settling on the Okinawa air base.

He was a graduate of Klamath Union high school with the class of 1949, coming to Klamath Falls with his parents in 1942.

He has been attached to the 30th air force squadron, of the 19th air group.

### Police Car Puts Spotlight On Six-Block Suicide Walk

RICHMOND, Calif. (AP)—The patrol car's spotlight glared on a young couple.

"The man had his left arm around the woman and his right fist jammed in the small of her back," Officer D. J. Green reported. "We could hear her pleading, 'Please don't kill me! Please let me go!'"

The man was husky 26-year-old Don Munson. The woman was his wife. The time was Saturday night.

Police had been called by the girl's uncle, Jack Diamond. He reported Mrs. Munson sought refuge in his home but Munson forced her to leave at gunpoint.

The man and woman walked for six blocks. The glare of the spotlight never left them.

At the edge of a vacant lot, Mrs. Munson called to officers: "Don't do anything. He'll shoot. I don't want to die."

Munson backed over the lot. He held his wife between himself and police. Other cars sirened up.

The woman stumbled and fell. Munson dropped beside her. He asked, "Do you love me?" "Yes, Yes!" in a high voice. Then a pistol cracked. Munson

slumped, dead with a bullet through his brain. The police report said: "Suicide."

### Dark Moles Dangerous

DALLAS, (AP)—Be wary of any "bluish-black" mole on your body: it could be a "dangerous" cancer, two doctors say.

Dr. James A. Hendrick of San Antonio, Tex. and Dr. Grant Ward of Baltimore declared in a report to the opening of the 45th annual meeting of the Southern Medical Assoc.

"Bluish-black moles can be one of the most dangerous cancers occurring on the human body. When these moles are located on areas where they may be irritated, they undergo cancerous change and are quickly disseminated over the entire body which prevents their cure."

They said that "any solitary mole" should be cut out by the patient's doctor and examined under the microscope to determine if it is cancerous.

"The form of treatment of mole with caustics, acids, electric needles, or radium is extremely dangerous," they said, "as these agents frequently will not destroy the mole but may stimulate growth to the extent that it can no be cured."

ELEVEN KILLED  
RIO DE JANEIRO, (AP)—A truck crashed into a light pole Sunday night causing a power line to fall and electrify 11 of the 79 persons riding in the truck. Nineteen others were hurt. Those aboard the truck were members of a small amateur soccer club returning from a game.

### Dorris Men Are Wounded

DORRIS—Two Dorris men have been listed as casualties in Korean fighting, and one more has been awarded the combat infantryman's badge, according to word received here.

Pvt. Luther Stumbaugh, grandson of Mr. and Mrs. A. A. Mitchell, has been flown from Japan to Letterman's hospital, San Francisco, where he is recuperating from injuries suffered in Korea—his third wound of the war.

Stumbaugh is reported to have a compound fracture of the skull and a pierced ear drum. Authorities say he will need six months hospitalization.

Pfc. Harry Eugene (Gene) Henderson, brother of Mrs. Vic Cavener of Dorris, is in a Tokyo army hospital recovering from wounds suffered in the Korean conflict. No details have been made available.

Henderson is a past student body president of Butte Valley high school, and his wife, Stepanny, is visiting her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Jones, Anchorage, Alaska.

Pfc. David Gillis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Gillis, Macdonel, has been awarded the combat infantryman's badge for proficiency in close quarter combat with the enemy. The badge distinguishes front line veterans from rear echelons.

### Jail Roster Balances Off

One prisoner was added to the county jail roster this morning and one subtracted.

An Indian from Beatty, 38-year-old Herman Sam, was sentenced from the Sprague River justice court to serve 90 days on a disorderly conduct conviction.

Released by Judge M. A. Carter on a 90-day suspended sentence, was 26-year-old Mrs. Leila Harvill, October 26 she pleaded guilty in court to a charge of lewd cohabitation.

Along with Mrs. Harvill, George Washington Griffin, 25, pleaded guilty to lewd cohabitation and was sentenced to 6 months in jail by Judge Carter.

But Griffin will first have to serve five years in the Oregon state prison for violation of probation. His violation was revoked by Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg the same day that Griffin was sentenced in district court.

Griffin was placed on probation a year ago on conviction of larceny.
