LONDON, (AP)—More than 6000 London university students staged a two-mile Guy Fawkes parade Monday night. Many of the floats

good-naturedly jibed the Americans and nominated Britain to be the 49th state of the United States. A member of the London University Student Union said the American embassy had told the union it did not object to the playful dig and "thought it all rather funny."

The big parade—plus beer and fireworks—was part of the English celebration of the legendary failure of Guy Fawkes in his plot to blow up the houses of parliament on November 5, 1605.

El Capitan Ran Gamut of Burlesque to Television

HOLLYWOOD, (AP)—Show business people, who are inclined to wax sentimental about theaters, could have a field day with the El Capitan in Hollywood. In its 23 years, it has just about run the gamut of show business.

As a matter of fact, I got a twinge of nostalgia when I visited the old house this week. It evoked many memories of the past. But you'd hardly know the theater now; it's full of booms and cameras and aprons and control booths. Having completed the cycle of entertainment, it is now a television studio for such comics as Eddie Cantor, Jimmy Durante, Danny Thomas and Martin and Lewis.

Jerry Lewis was in diapers and television was merely a dream when the El Capitan first opened. That was on January 24, 1927 when Bertou Churchill played his famous "alias the Deacon." It was in the boom era of Los Angeles, and the theater, then named the Hollywood Playhouse, was promoted by a local financier at a cost of \$600,000. The era passed and so did the promoter, who was later imprisoned for embezzlement.

PORTLAND, (AP)—Municipal Judge J. Murchison Monday fined a Portland grocer \$10 for selling cigarettes to a 13-year-old boy. The boy admitted he had forged his mother's signature on a note requesting the cigarettes. State law permits grocers to sell cigarettes to minors if they have a note from their parents, but a city ordinance prohibits the practice, Judge Murchison said.

The mother, Mrs. Marian Smith, said she had instructed her son to write the letter and forge her signature. She then followed the boy to the store of Aaron Thornburg, witnessed the sale, and then reported the matter to police. The boy said he had forged his mother's signature on previous occasions to get cigarettes.

The judge said he had to fine the grocer, but reprimanded the mother for the method she used to trap the grocer.
