## Woman Killed, Suitor Sought

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP)—A balding, 63-year-old storage garage operator was sought today in the killing of a young woman who refused to marry him.

Deputy Sheriff A. C. Brannen said a statewide alarm was out for Richard Bauman, accused by eyewitnesses of shooting Mrs. Marian Roberts and critically wounding her 14-year-old daughter and her mother.

Mrs. Roberts, attractive supermarket cashier in her early thirties, was shot in the forehead and eye at her home while eating supper last night.

Her daughter, Marilyn, was wounded in the body. Her mother, Mrs. Alta Mae Warner, 61, was shot in the arm and lost a large quantity of blood from a severed artery.

Another daughter, nine-year-old Carolyn Dawn, hid behind her mother until she could run out and tell neighbors she wasn't hurt.

Brannen said Mrs. Warner and Carolyn identified the killer as Bauman.

Mrs. Warner said Bauman had been rejected by Mrs. Roberts several times and had threatened to shoot the young woman, Brannen related.

## Navy Officer Tests Dec. 8

College aptitude tests for selection of candidates for the 1952 reserve officer's training corps will be held December 8, according to local naval recruiter Chief Frank Roemer, and applications must be submitted to reach the testing service, Princeton, N.J., not later than November 17.

Blanks are available at the local naval recruiting office, postoffice building.

Eligibility requires an applicant to be a male citizen of the United States, who has reached his 17th birthday and not passed his 21st, unless contemplating a five year college course, by July 1, 1952. High school diplomas are required, and applicants must be unmarried, and never have been married, as well as pass the physical requirements necessary.

## Club Brawl Hearing Set

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Columist Florabel Muir will have to tell Franchot Tene's lawyer about that little set-to at a night club.

Tene got a court order yesterday directing Miss Muir to give testimony November 19 at the office of Tene's attorney.

Miss Muir made a "citizen's arrest" of Tene, saying he had spit in her face and kicked her shins. At the same time, Tene said, she made the narcotics accusation. The actor said medical tests, made immediately at his insistence, proved he was not under the influence of narcotics.

Tene also asked that testimony be obtained from Miss Muir and others about the "unlawful and fraudulent" recording of telephone conversations between him and Barbara Payton before their recent marriage.

He said the recording was made over the telephone of Elizabeth Cowgill, who shared a party line with Miss Payton. Testimony about this incident will be taken November 20, the court said.
