

Bloodmobile Here Tuesday for Longer Period To Meet Increasing Number of Basin Donors

The Red Cross bloodmobile comes to town Tuesday, this time with more help and a longer hour schedule to meet the expected crowd of donors.

The hours will be 1 to 6 p.m. Appointments by persons wishing to donate blood may be made by phoning Mrs. Hugh Swaney, 3213; Mrs. L. Orth Sismore, 4393; or the Red Cross office, 7184.

Last month a few persons were turned away late in the bloodmobile's Klamath Falls stay because facilities were already taxed to the limit. However, says Virginia Dixon, executive secretary of the local chapter, the operation should run off more smoothly this time.

Last month the unit received 189 pints of blood here.

The blood-donating process, which has little ill effect on a

healthy person, actually takes very little time.

Blood taken here is shipped to Portland where it is typed at a regional blood center and distributed to the military forces overseas or made available to hospitals in communities which are affiliated with the Red Cross program.

Blood not needed for the armed forces or for hospitals is processed into plasma and stocked in blood banks. There in particular is the critical need. The armed forces and hospitals have been taken care

of fairly well in the blood program, but the blood banks have been neglected to the point that the situation would be extremely critical in event of any sort of great disaster in this country.

Some of the blood comes back to Klamath Falls. Hillside and Klamath Valley hospitals use about 45 pints a month, the fluid itself costing the patient nothing. Having a supply here has made a change in treatment of some type of cases, doctors report. In the past blood was administered as

something of a last resort, after a "walking donor" with the proper type blood and physical condition was found.

The physical condition is important. A donor for the Red Cross program should be between 18 and 59, and those under 21 need written parental permission. For four hours prior to donating, donors should not eat or drink eggs, milk, butter or other fatty foods but should consume lots of liquids. A physical examination will be given at the armory before blood is taken.

Negro Admits Costly Arson

JACKSON, La. (AP)—Supt. L. F. Magruder says a Negro mental patient admitted setting fires which caused \$469,765 damage at Louisiana's mental hospital here.

The fires Tuesday night destroyed an abandoned ward, a mattress factory and a paint truck, and damaged a Negro male ward and a hog barn. No one was injured and none escaped.

Dr. Magruder identified the patient yesterday only as a 21-year-old Negro man.

The superintendent said the patient told this story:

After bed check, he broke a first-story window and climbed out. Using old papers, he set fire to the vacant ward building, the mattress factory and truck.

Then he went to a building on the hospital grounds about two miles from the fires and fell asleep. He was found there yesterday morning and taken into custody.

Magruder said the man once tried to escape from a New York mental institution by burning down a door.
