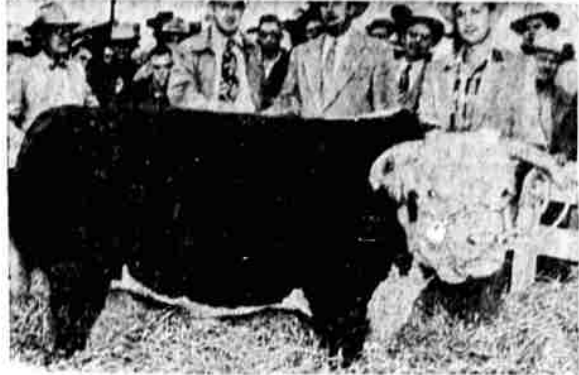


BLOOD DONATIONS ASKED

Two Slayings Being Probed

EUSTIS, Fla., (U)—Four separate investigations were pointed today toward this little mid-Florida town following the shooting of two Negro rapists. The pair had been granted a new trial after receiving death sentences for the rape of a young white farm wife. Samuel Shepherd, 23, was killed, and his companion, Walter Lee Irvin, also 23, was seriously wounded Tuesday night by Sheriff Willis B. McCall of Lake county. McCall, who said he acted in self defense, is confined in a hospital here. Doctors said he was suffering with shock.

Investigations were under way by the justice department, the Lake county grand jury, the National Assoc. for the Advancement of Colored People, and by Gov. Fuller Warren's office.
