Alaskan Fire Takes 2 Lives

BETHEL, Alaska, (AP)—Fire swept Bethel's two main buildings yesterday claiming the lives of a school teacher and a hotel manager.

The Bethel school superintendent said an 18-year-old native from Kipnuk village was missing after the fire but it was not determined whether he was a victim.

The dead were Mrs. Beatie Smith, about 60, a territorial public school teacher, and Ann Joyce, manager of a roadside hotel.

The school superintendent said five others escaped through windows of the roadside after fire broke out in the kitchen about 5:30 a.m.

The roadside and the town's movie house, owned by the Northern Commercial Co., were burned to the ground with a loss estimated unofficially at \$50,000. Cause of the fire was not known.

Bank Bandits Nabbed Quick

MILWAUKEE, (AP)—A quick round trip ended in Milwaukee last night for three young men and their red-headed girl friend — 13 hours after a precision planned bank holdup which netted them \$93,569.

They exchanged banter but there was visible trembling as the four appeared before U.S. Commissioner Floyd Jenkins. He jailed them under \$50,000 bond each on identical charges of violating the federal bank robbery act.

"That's reasonable," one of them said.

Jenkins set next Wednesday as arraignment date for James Joseph Leather, 36, Chicago; Harold Dennis Hall, 19, who gave his last address as Los Angeles; Glenn Dale Maroe, 21, who also said he was from Los Angeles; and Anne Snyder, Chicago.

There was nothing like that in their plans when the three men stepped out of a snowstorm into the Northwestern National bank at 10:30 a.m. yesterday.

Two of them, armed with a rifle and shotgun, took up posts at the door while the third vaulted behind the cages and scooped money into a pillow case.

They fled into the snowstorm and sped westward in a dark colored sedan. But six blocks away they switched cars. The value of

that maneuver was lessened by a postman who saw them get into a light blue later model sedan.

The four rode the main route to Chicago—highway 41—to the Wisconsin-Illinois border. Lake County, Ill., deputy sheriffs Clayton Tiffany and Thomas Coker, alerted about the holdup, spotted the car. Their suspicions were heightened when one man kept turning to watch them.

The deputies halted the car and jumped out with guns ready. But they met no resistance. Miss Snyder was in front between two of the men while the third man was hidden under blankets in the back seat.

The FBI reported the loot was recovered, some already on the persons of the bandits but most of it with the bank tape still around the bundles of bills.
