### Apprenticeship Pays Off For Versatile Jane Wyman

 HOLLYWOOD, (AP) — Film critics have been marveling at the fact that Jane Wyman is currently starring in two hit movies — one a farce comedy and the other a weeping drama. And now the girl is further showing her versatility by becoming a singing star on records.

Jane has been called back for a repeat picture with Bing Crosby. Their comedy gave Der Bingle a much-needed hypo for his career. I chatted with her on the "Famous" set, attempting to learn some secrets for her success.

"I've been in the long apprenticeship you served at Warner's?"

"What else?" she replied. "That sort of thing pays off, you know. Why, do you realize that since Etta Davis left the lot, I am the oldest gal left there? And only Errol Flynn among the actors has been there longer. I started in 1935 and he preceded me only by a year."

In those days Jane did everything, from musicals to Westerns. "Those pictures were made in eight, 10 or 12 days," she recalled. "Compare that to the 17 weeks, including tests and actual shooting, I worked on 'Blue Veil.'"

"Man, those old pictures were something! I was laughing that other day about something that happened in a picture with Frank McHugh. I was his leading lady in those days, and I had a scene in which I was supposed to run through the room. Those pictures couldn't even afford rugs; they just painted the floor to look like rugs. Well, I came running in, slipped and hid the length of the room."

Despite the excitement of movie making in those days, Jane said she wouldn't care to return to them. "I couldn't make a picture that fast any more," she said. "It's just too much work."

Her current film is reminiscent of her earlier days, since she plays a musical star and displays her legs in a modified strip tease. This will be the first time in several seasons that movie goers will get a glimpse of her classy chassis. She's again cheesecake.

"I haven't done any cheesecake since early Warner's days," she said. "I don't believe in it, unless it is called for in the script. I think if they use leg art to publicize pictures in which none appears, the public gets a wrong notion about the pictures."

"And my pictures, in recent years haven't exactly called for cheesecake. You couldn't imagine Ma Baxter of 'The Yearling' in a bathing suit, could you? Or the gal in 'Johnny Belinda'?"

 Jane's new career as a recording artist happened by accident. "It was Bing's doing," she explained. "After we did the picture together he asked me if I wanted to come over to Decca and cut a disc of 'In the Cool, Cool, Cool of the Evening.' I said, 'are you kidding? But he wasn't and so we did the thing together.'"

One record led to another, and now she's being hailed as a "Dinah Shore of tomorrow."

"Well, let's say 'the Dinah Shore of the day' before yesterday," she corrected.
