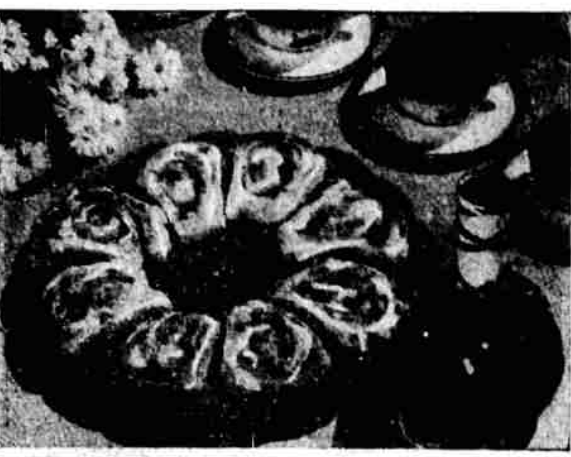

**Taste Ticklers Will Please Family Thanksgiving Morn**

Why not have something extra-giving to greet the family at Thanksgiving? Serve this professional-looking cinnamon roll wreath while gift warm and dripping with frosting. It is so impressive to look at and so good to eat that you will want to use it often in the days to come.

**Frosted Cinnamon Wreath**  
 1 package prepared hot roll mix  
 3 tablespoons soft butter  
 2 teaspoons cinnamon  
 1/2 cup brown or dark brown sugar  
 1-3 cup raisins

Prepare package of hot roll mix and let rise as directed, or use your own favorite roll dough. When light, roll into 12 in. x 16 in. rectangle. Spread rolled out dough with soft butter mixed with cinnamon. Sprinkle with brown sugar (or dark brown sugar) and raisins and roll as for jelly roll. Cut into 1 inch slices. Arrange slices, cut side down, in a circle, on a well-greased baking sheet, leaving the center free. Let rise in warm place until light and almost double in bulk. Bake in a moderately hot oven (375 degrees) for 20 to 25 minutes. Makes 1 wreath, 12 in. in diameter about 16 rolls. Serve plain or frost while warm.

**Butter Frosting**  
 1/2 cup butter  
 4 tablespoons milk  
 2 cups sifted powdered sugar  
 1 teaspoon vanilla  
 Combine butter and milk in saucepan and heat just until butter melts. Gradually stir in powdered sugar. Stir until mixture is smooth. Let stand 10 minutes, then spread on cinnamon wreath. This frosting is good, too, lightly flavored with cinnamon.

**Jiffy Coffee Cake**  
 1/4 cup soft shortening  
 1/4 cup pure cane sugar  
 1 egg  
 1/4 cup orange juice  
 1/4 cup milk  
 1/2 cup sifted flour  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 1/2 teaspoon salt

**Swede Author Nobel Winner**

STOCKHOLM, (AP)—The Swedish academy today awarded the 1951 Nobel prize for literature to one of its own members, Par Lagerkvist, author of the novels "The Dwarf" and "Barabbas." Lagerkvist, who is 60 years old and playwright, poet, essayist and writer of short stories as well as a novelist, will receive a check for 167,612 crowns (\$32,357) from King Gustav Adolf at the Nobel prize presentation ceremony to be held in Stockholm December 10.

He is the fourth Swede to win the prize. Previous Swedish winners were Saima Lagerlof, Verner von Heidenstam and Erik Axel Karlfeldt.

In choosing Lagerkvist, the academy, of which he has been a member since 1940, clearly followed the wishes of the donor of the prize, Alfred Nobel, Nobel stipulated that the writing of prize winners should have an "idealistic tendency."

Although Lagerkvist has written more than 39 books since he published his first work in 1912, he was little known outside Scandinavia until the appearance of his novel of the renaissance, "The Dwarf," in 1944. It appeared in translation in the U.S. 1945.

**Inspector Said Suicide Victim**  
 MANHASSET, N. Y. (AP)—Thomas D. Behne, 53, described as an inspector for the bureau of internal revenue in New York City, shot and killed himself Wednesday night, police reported.

Behne's body was found by his two children, John, 16, and Susan, 9, who heard a shot in an upstairs room of their home while they were watching television in the basement.

Behne had held a shotgun against his right cheek and fired, police said. Police said no note was found. They called the case a suicide.
