

Warren May Try New Tactics in Campaign

SACRAMENTO, (AP)—Gov. Earl Warren may switch from his 1948 strategy and enter Republican primaries in a few select states in his quest for the presidential nomination.

Man Admits Bedbug Plant

HANAU, Germany, (AP)—Paul Sonnefeld, 54, started serving a four-month jail term here today for hiring his nephew to place bedbugs in the rooms of a rival hotel.

Warren intimate dropped that hint today. He added, however, the governor has no definite plans and may not decide for some time.

Warren announced his 1952 candidacy Wednesday with a call for party unity. He campaigned for the nomination only in California in 1948. He became Gov. Thomas E. Dewey's running mate.

Now he is considering going into other states, particularly in the Far West, seeking enough convention pledges to be regarded as more than a dark horse or compromise candidate.

Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-Ohio), only other avowed candidate, has predicted he will be nominated on the first ballot.

Warren's campaigning for convention votes, an aide said, may depend on out of state reaction to a Republican policy speech he delivers tomorrow night to the state central committee in San Diego.

Another factor, obviously, is what Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower does.

The informant said that Warren, whose campaign know-how has given him three terms as governor, would not hesitate to oppose Taft in a state like Oregon.

But the source said, Warren would step aside if it came to an Eisenhower-Taft fight. Eisenhower hasn't said whether he will run.

The governor has been careful not to give any hint of his views toward other prospective candidates.

FRIENDLY Warren has remained friendly with Dewey. He sometimes has differed with Taft politically, but otherwise the Warren aide pointed out, "they respect each other and get along fine."

Taft has indicated he'll stay out of the California primaries.

At San Diego, Warren will assert the Republicans must offer the voters a liberal platform to win in '52. He also will urge the GOP to adopt his controversial pre-paid health insurance plan—a program turned down by three California legislators.

His policies have caused certain conservatives to split away from the party. They want an unimpaired delegation.

Attack Jury Deadlocks

YANVEYVILLE, N.C., (AP)—A mistrial was ordered today in the case of a Negro sharecropper accused of assaulting a 17-year-old white girl by allegedly leering at her and chasing her.

The mistrial was ordered by Judge J. A. Rousseau after the jury, composed of four Negroes and eight whites, deliberated for about five hours yesterday and today and reported it was "hopelessly deadlocked."

Foreman C. J. Long told the court that the jury had voted 10 for conviction and two for acquittal. He said two Negro jurors had held out for acquittal.

Roof Falls, Three Killed

CORPUS CHRISTI, (AP)—Collapse of a roof under construction killed three men and injured at least 20 others yesterday at the Reynolds Metals Co. San Antonio plant.

The roof was on a 70-foot ore storage silo.

Killed were Glenn James Tucker, 40, and Vicente Charo, 27, both of Corpus Christi, and Marcelo Yalsquez, 25, Kingsville.

Nineteen of the 21 men working at the top fell with the debris—30,000 pounds of concrete in addition to timbers and steel.

Four others were buried at the bottom of the silo.

Million Car Deaths Near

CHICAGO, (AP)—As the one millionth traffic death since the advent of the automobile drew near, the National Safety Council today geared its statistical service to a weekly basis.

It reported that as of today there have been 995,600 deaths in automobile mishaps since gas bugles began scarring horses off the pavement around the turn of the century.

The council estimated that the one millionth death will occur during the third week of December.

"This tragic event would make a mockery of all that Christmas stands for," Ned H. Dearborn, council president, said in a statement. "I appeal to everyone to drive and walk with extreme caution during the next few weeks."

The millionth traffic death can be delayed if everyone does his part. "Don't you be one in a million!"
