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Red Atrocities Rip Secrecy Veil From Reason for Cease-Fire Snarl

TOKYO, (AP)—A highly placed official said today the unscheduled announcement that Red troops murdered more than 5000 American prisoners has stripped the veil of mystery from what has been holding up Korean Armistice talks.

The general officer, who is exceptionally well informed on truce negotiations, said:

"The Communists don't want to have to answer questions about what happened to their prisoners."

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ABOUT FACES

Since the talks began July 10, both the communist and United Nations delegations have done several abrupt about faces. Each change has been explained by thousands of words of propaganda.

Tired mimeograph machines have given up tiresome communications.

But every time the U. N. reversed itself, or the Reds either, the same basic problem was still to blame.

The problem is in the objectives of the two delegations.

The Reds want a cease-fire. In fact the U. N. delegation, led by Vice Adm. C. Turner Joy, almost got itself mouse-trapped into agreeing on a buffer zone which would divide the opposing forces before the other armistice details were agreed upon.

What the tricky open field running Joy and his chief assistant, Maj. Gen. Henry I. Hodges have been doing lately was to get them out of the trap they almost got caught in.

That would have given the Reds exactly what they wanted—a cease-fire and freedom from U. N. guns, planes and battlehips without having to agree to a full armistice.

DIFFERENCE
The difference in a cease-fire and an armistice is this: A cease-fire is only part of an armistice. In addition to a cease-fire, an armistice would include insurance against the resumption of fighting, exchange of prisoners and recommendations for the withdrawal of all foreign troops from Korea.

From the very start the Reds indicated they didn't want anything but a cease-fire.

The U. N. delegation won the first round when it got the Reds to adopt an agenda. This seemed to guarantee an armistice and not a cease-fire.

But the Reds won the second round when the items on the agenda were listed.

The first item for discussion was effecting a cease-fire and drawing a buffer zone between the opposing forces.
