Reporter Marooned On Sea Assignment

(Editor's Note — Charles Keim Port Angeles Evening News reporter, boarded the coast guard cutter Northwind last week as it set out to aid the freighter George Walton then afloat off the Washington coast. Keim was "marooned" at sea when the Northwind was ordered to remain behind, after other vessels rescued the Walton's survivors, and attempt to tow the freighter's burned hull to port. Keim describes his plight in the following dispatch, relayed by the coast guard.)

ABOARD COAST GUARD CUTTER NORTHWIND, (P)—Next time I am asked to give my service background, I shall say as follows: "U.S. infantry, volunteered, 1940 to 1945. United States coast guard, drafted November 6, 1951, until almost the end of the month."

My coast guard service began something like a routine assignment. On November 6, just as I was sitting down to a venison dinner at my home the Port Angeles News City Editor Earl Clark called me on the telephone.

"Chuck," he said, "The liberty ship George Walton is afloat 300 odd miles off Cape Flattery. You can board the coast guard cutter Northwind which is stopping in Port Angeles to take some medical officers aboard."

"The Northwind will pick up survivors. Take the camera. Get some pictures and the story. It will take 24 hours to go and 24 hours to return, if all goes well."

"That was one week ago today. I got the story. Sent it in by wireless. Got some fine pictures, but how to get them home? Well, maybe some historian will want them for his book."

Life has been far from dull. For the past week we have been circling the still burning George Walton waiting to tow it home. We have kept track of it by eye during daylight and by radar at night. And we have ridden out two storms, with gales up to 60 miles per hour.

To write this story, I have tied myself to a chair and tied down my typewriter. Above decks the hardy Northwind crew is taking advantage of this "moderated"
