They are far ahead of the Hollywood product in depicting life. Take pictures like 'La Ronde' and 'Devil in the Flesh.'"

Gunmen Kill Hotel Clerk

ST. LOUIS (AP)—Gunmen shot to death a hotel clerk and wounded two other persons, including a policeman, during two attempted holdups last night. John Kreiger, 33, Windsor hotel clerk, was killed when he resisted two masked men. Bennett Crump, 37-year-old Negro elevator operator, was shot in the back and seriously wounded as he fled from the pair. About two hours later Glennon Frederick Johnson, 35, a motorcycle patrolman, surprised two men after wounding one of them. Police identified them as Dillard O. Wren, St. Louis, and Samuel N. Reese, Booneville, Mo., and said they were being held for investigation in both shootings. No charges have been filed.

Eden Enters Pelican Tilt, Soothes Pouting Louisiana

By ED CURTIS. LONDON (AP)—Foreign Secy. Anthony Eden stepped in today to smooth the somewhat ruffled pelican relations between Louisiana and Texas. Just as four pelicans arrived here by air as a gift from Texas, Eden made a swift diplomatic move. He cabled the British consul general, Alan David Francis, at New Orleans to accept Louisiana's offer of pelicans, too. The Texas and Louisiana birds eventually will be turned loose in St. James's park, in front of Buckingham palace, replacing the last of the park's traditional pelicans which died some time ago. Hearing that St. James's park was pelicanless, both Texas and Louisiana offered to supply some.

Eden followed up its offer with the quick dispatch of four pelicans by plane. The birds traveled as part of the baggage of James Carter, news editor of The Galveston News. Carter, as 'ambassador to the park of St. James's' in charge of pelican affairs, proudly handed over the birds at London airport to Maj. I. K. V. Hobkirk, Bailiff of the royal park. The birds, about six months old with beaks a foot and a half long, were sent to the London zoo. They will be left there until they get used to the English weather. At this time of year it usually is a drizzle interspersed with periods of day and night.
