18 Teams Unscathed

NEW YORK. (AP)—The list of undefeated, untied college football teams stood at 18—and 12 of them have completed their seasons. Valparaiso, Northern Illinois and Bucknell finished the season's business with nine victories each. South Dakota Mines, Illinois Wesleyan, (Pa.) teachers, College of Emporia (Kans.) and Lawrence (Wis.) all had eight wins.

Among the major schools still boasting clean slates are Stanford with nine triumphs, Michigan State, Princeton, Tennessee, Maryland and San Francisco with eight each.

Teds, Cowboys Upset Stanford Clinches Rose Bowl Berth

Illinois Must Top Wildcats

NEW YORK. (AP)—The 1951 college football season heads into its final big week with almost as many major teams already assured of Bowl berths as are on the unbeaten and untied list.

And it's highly possible that by sundown Saturday the situation will be reversed, for two of the six remaining with perfect records face really rugged opposition and a third will have its work cut out for it. Also, Saturday's results may give the four assured Bowl teams some company.

Oddly enough, the two teams most likely to drop from the unbeaten slate—Tennessee and Stanford—already are assured of action in the Jan. 1 Bowl bonanza. Tennessee, which must meet 1951's comeback champions, the Kentucky Wildcats, is lined up for the Sugar Bowl, and Stanford, which must go against powerful California, clinched a Rose Bowl bid Saturday by whipping Oregon State, 35-14.

21 STRAIGHT

Princeton, the third unbeaten-untied team with a tough game Saturday, does not figure in the Bowl picture because of an Ivy league agreement. The Tigers, with Saturday's 27-0 trouncing of Yale their 21st straight win, face Dartmouth, which always points for the season's finale for both teams.

Otherwise, the teams with all-winning records should conclude their seasons that way. Maryland, sound for the Sugar Bowl against Tennessee, is heavily favored of the West Virginia-Michigan State, No. 1 team in the land, should romp over Colorado, and San Francisco should have no trouble against UCLA of Los Angeles next Sunday. Michigan State also is out of the Bowl picture because of Big 10 rules, but San Francisco is available.

TO ORANGE BOWL

The other Bowl-bound team is Georgia Tech, due to go to the Orange Bowl.

Two games which share the limelight with the Tennessee-Kentucky and Stanford-California struggles should give some idea as to the other Bowlers.

Illinois could clinch the Big 10 title and subsequent Rose Bowl trip by beating—or tying—Northwestern, and the Illini have lost five straight to Northwestern. Illinois' conference record is 4-0-1 after the disappointing scoreless tie with Ohio State, and Wisconsin (4-1-1) has an easy foe Saturday in Minnesota. Likewise, Purdue (3-1) will be favored over Indiana. Wisconsin trounced Iowa, Saturday, 34-7, while Purdue was edging Minnesota, 19-13. Northwestern clipped Michigan, 6-0.

FINAL DAY

But, whoever wins, the Southwest conference won't be settled as usual—until the final day of the season, Dec. 1. Rice, now with a 3-1 conference record, plays Baylor (2-1-1) that day and Texas Christian (also 3-1) winds up against Southern Methodist. Baylor plays SMU this week, while Texas (3-2) winds up against Texas A & M Nov. 29. Texas whipped TCU, 32-21, Saturday.

For a while, it looked as though the New York Giants, a young and aggressive club, would give the Clevelanders a battle. But the issue was settled yesterday when Cleveland ground out a 10-0 victory over the Giants before a bumper crowd of 52,215—the largest turnout for a pro football game at the Polo Grounds since 1946.

PLANS COMEBACK

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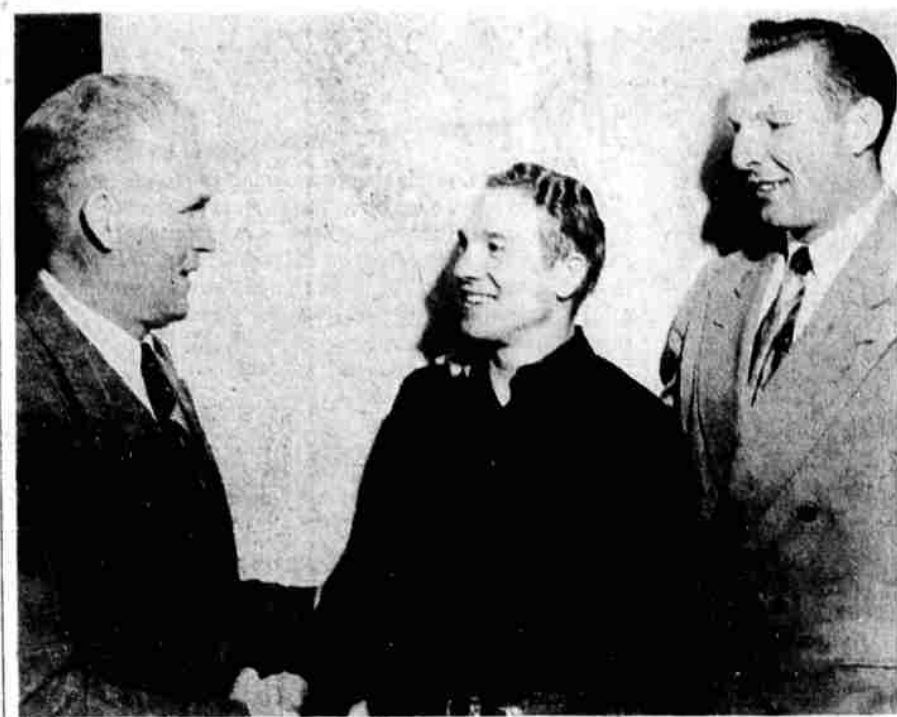

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Mac-Hi, Vale Win Openers

Members of the Oregon State School Activities' association's board of control were to decide today by a telephone poll the dates and places for this weekend's state high school football play-off games.

Class A quarter-final contests will pit Grant of Portland against Toledo, Astoria against North Marion, Grants Pass against Coquille and Milton-Freewater against Vale.

MINOR UPSET

Vale turned in a minor upset by dumping Prineville, 19-7. Both teams were untied and unbeaten, but Prineville ranked No. 1 in the poll, while Vale was untied.

The Vale-Milton-Freewater game will be regarded by most fans as the major contest of next weekend.

Grant, co-Portland champion with Roosevelt and No. 4 in the poll, is a heavy favorite over Toledo, which tied Columbia Prep of Portland, 6-6. Toledo, undefeated in 25 games, stayed in the play-off only because it made more first downs.

PASSES WIN

Grant won its play-off opener from Bend, 21-6, on quarterback Johnny Keller's three touchdown passes. Two were to end Jerry Exley.

Astoria, which swamped a highly rated Hillsboro team, 32-7, is expected to have no trouble disposing of North Marion. North Marion was tied by Canby 14-14, and also remained in the play-off by leading in first downs.

Undefeated, untied Astoria was ranked No. 3 in the AP poll.

Grants Pass, the No. 1 team, is heavily favored over Coquille. Grants Pass had some uneasy minutes before forging ahead of Marshfield to win, 25-13. Once-beaten Coquille looked good in beating unbeaten but once-tied University high of Eugene, 20-6.

Gervais won its way into the Class B semi-finals by trimming Knappa, 13-7. Creswell wallowed Drain, 19-0, while Phoenix routed Maupin, 20-0. Wallawa trounced Grant Union, 33-0.
