### U.S. Troops Reach Europe

BREMERHAVEN, Germany, (AP)—Advance elements of the 28th infantry division — "Pennsylvania's own" national guard — arrived in Germany Wednesday to complete the American reinforcement of General Dwight Eisenhower's European army.

Gen. Eisenhower himself was on his way to greet the 28th personally as the vanguard of the division steamed into this big U.S. supply port aboard the transport General Butler.

It was a gloomy, rainy morning. But the 2000 soldiers aboard the Butler cheered and waved as the big transport docked.

They answered with yells when the welcoming band played the division's song, "Roll On, 28th."

The 28th, known as the Keystone division, is the last to arrive of four U.S. divisions poured into Germany this year to bolster the frontlines along the iron curtain.

With the 28th, the United States now has six combat divisions in West Germany. Altogether the Western Allied combat forces in this vital area number more than 12 divisions and are expected to reach 14 by the year's end.

### Bologna, Beer Price Up Seen

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The prices of hot dogs, bologna and some pork sausage will go up somewhere around two cents a pound, effective Monday, under new rules issued today by the office of price stabilization.

OPS said new rules governing prices of fresh and semi-dry sausage containing beef—hot dogs and bologna for example—were revised to pass on to processors higher material costs.

The announcement said the increase will compensate processors for a hike in the permissible price for beef at wholesale which it ordered in mid-September.

Pork sausage packed in sheep castings also is covered by the order, reflecting what OPS said are higher costs for the casings.

Officials estimated the increase in both cases will average about two cents a pound at retail shops.

Meanwhile, OPS was at work on another order which will permit the price of beer for home consumption to advance about a cent a bottle. Officials are aiming for a target date of December 1, but the order may be delayed somewhat beyond that date.

Increased labor and packaging costs were said by officials to be the reason for the forthcoming order, which will affect the nation's 350 breweries, 8000 wholesalers and more than 250,000 beer retailers.

The actual price increase may be less than one cent. But coupled with the recent tax boost of three-tenths on a standard bottle or can, it will permit retailers to charge a full penny more.

NEW DELHI, India, (AP)—Sixteen persons died Wednesday in the crash of an Indian airliner at Calcutta's Dum Dum airport. The 17th person aboard was reported in a serious condition.
