

Fremont Students Earn Money To Support Many Activities During Year

There's a lot of cash in the bank book of the Fremont junior high school student body enough so you'd think only faculty members would keep tight hold of the purse strings.

The junior high student body has earned for itself, through the sale of student body tickets and magazine subscriptions, \$1313.20. And the money belongs to the students, to be handled as they see fit.

Principal Lowell Kaup says the teachers only advise the youngsters as to the wisest use of the funds. They have prepared estimates which after being divided up among 15 or 16 separate expenditures—including a 10¢ federal tax—may still have \$66.90 as a balance.

That is if the youngsters can spend as planned, and no more.

Controller of the student body treasury is the junior high student council, headed by Pres. Bruce Kellmeyer and consisting of Vice Pres. Francis Pfeifferle, Second Vice Pres. Jimmy Blanton, Secy. Caroline Nancarrow and Treas. Paulsen Fisher.

On the representative board from each class in the junior high are Gary Brager, Jane Glasgow, Mark Fair, Sharon Hahn, Geoff Moore, Marilyn Nancarrow, Clara Shaw and Larry Worden.

Physical education alone draws \$225 from the student fund for basketball, officials, for lettermen's letters and midgets. The social committee draws another \$200, and graduation is marked down for an expenditure of \$100. National school assemblies are scheduled to receive \$135 from the fund, and the school itself is slated for a \$50 gift from the class of 1952. Another \$50 is marked for next year's student body use.

A \$200 fund is tabbed on the expenditure sheet for awards for sales of magazine subscriptions, and another \$50 is already in the miscellaneous column. Various clubs and committees divide up most of the remainder, and take an active part in the administration of the funds.

Among other needs the student body is working out an expenditure for a public address system

Murder, Inc. Executioner Wins Gangland Reprieve

NEW YORK, (AP)—The Daily News said yesterday that Albert Anastasia, reputed one-time boss killer, scoffed at a report that he has been ordered to get out of town or face underworld execution.

"The story is completely fantastic," the news quoted the alleged former "lord high executioner" for the Murder, Inc., mob in Brooklyn as saying.

"There isn't a grain of truth in it. Only a degenerate could conceive such a story," Anastasia was quoted.

The report of threatened gangland execution came yesterday from the New York City anti-crime committee, a citizens group.

Underworld big shots granted Anastasia a reprieve from death on condition he get out of this area, the committee said.

The waterfront character, the report added, had been accused of working a "double cross" with racketeer Willie Moretti, slain last month in New Jersey. The nature of the "double cross" was not specified for the auditorium, not included in the above report of spendings. And yet, unlike the federal government, the youngsters feel they've filled the treasury with enough money to refrain from making announcements here and there during the school year.

The Daily News said Anastasia, 45-year-old resident of Fort Lee, N. J., told the paper:

"Only a degenerate who doesn't understand a man's love for his family could make up such a story."

"I'm going to stay here. The committee is full of hokey. I don't care what they do to me. But there's my little children and my poor wife. God will take care of those people who talk like that."

The committee said Anastasia and Moretti were marked for death together by the underworld high command. Bullets cut down Moretti in a Cliffside Park, N. J., restaurant on October 4.

The report continued that Anastasia apparently was tipped off and failed to appear at the restaurant to meet the same fate.

After Moretti's death, the committee said, gangland made another attempt on Anastasia's life but he fled, and later was granted a reprieve.

The committee did not announce the source of its information.

Forgetful Woman Tosses Out Gems

YONKERS, N. Y. (AP)—Police will start sifting incinerator ashes today for \$18,000 worth of jewelry which a somewhat forgetful woman put in an old shoe and tossed in a trash can.

Mrs. Edward Madden, wife of a New York printing ink company executive, yesterday reported the loss of the gems—a \$9,000 diamond bracelet, a \$5000 diamond and platinum ring and two \$2000 unmounted diamonds.

Mrs. Madden told police she took the jewelry from a safe deposit box to have it appraised. Then she put the gems in an old shoe in a closet.

During housecleaning several days later, the shoe was tossed into rubbish that was hauled to the city incinerator.
