Pioneers To Meet Cavemen

Milton-Freewater became the last team to enter the Class A semi-finals of the Oregon high school football play-offs by trouncing Vale, 40-12, Saturday.

The Pioneers, with a perfect record in 10 games this season and rated No. 4 in the Associated Press high school poll, will play Grants Pass, the No. 1 team, this weekend. Grants Pass has won 21 straight.

The other semi-final game will pit Astoria, the No. 3 team with 12 straight victories, against Grant of Portland, defending champion and ranked No. 4. Grant is trying to retain the title it has won two consecutive years.

FIVE OF EIGHT
In eight years of official Oregon prep championship play-offs, Grants has taken five titles. The Grants have never lost a play-off game.

The four semi-finalists were among the first six in the AP poll. Roosevelt of Portland, the first round by Milton-Freewater, and Astoria knocked off Hillsboro, rated No. 5.

Milton-Freewater will try to offset Grants Pass' powerful ground game with the deadly passing of quarterback Jerry Grims and the speedy running of back sacks as Jerry Lutscher.

PROMISE
The Astoria-Grant contest promises to be one of the closest, best-played of the season. Astoria showed devastating power in steam-rolling North Marion, 48-0, Friday night, while Grant looked just as good in crushing Toledo, 31-0.

Toledo's loss, incidentally, broke the coastal school's string of 25 games without a defeat.

Locations dates and times of the Class A, Class B and six-man play-off games were to be determined today.

Gervais won its way into the Class B final by beating Creswell 21-0. It will meet Walla, which defeated Phoenix, 21-13.

The six-man final will be between Coburg, which beat Valse, 40-20, and Jacksonville, victor over Boardman, 48-0.

Oretch Coach Skeet O'Connell said Saturday he would probably open with his four returning lettermen—with the race for the center spot wide open between Lebanon's Wayne Holdfuss and Grants Pass' John Koch.

VETERANS
The four veterans are guards Don Sutphin and Mary Hammack and forwards Jack Pinkley and Homer Duncan.

Last year Sutphin scored 226 points in Oregon Collegiate conference competition, second high in the loop. Duncan's 186 points was good enough for third place, while Hammack finished in the first 12 with 126 points.

Tackle Thompson and halfback Genetin are prospects taken off the football squad.

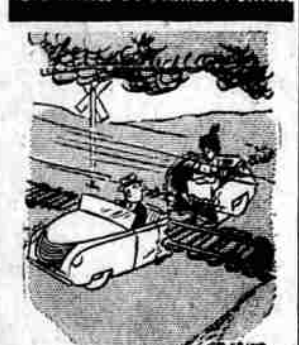

Yanks Get GP Hurler

NEW YORK, (U)—The New York Yankees have acquired pitcher Jim McDonald, a native of Grants Pass, Ore., from the St. Louis Browns.

McDonald, who now lives in Modesto, Calif., was traded for Clint Courtney, catcher for the Yanks' Kansas City farm club, officials of both teams announced Saturday.

McDonald, 24, bats and throws right-handed. During the 1951 season he beat the Yankees twice and defeated Cleveland and Boston once each.

Matson Five Yards Short

PASADENA, Calif., (U)—Fullback Ollie Matson fell five yards short of a new ground gaining record yesterday in leading University of San Francisco to a 20-2 triumph over Loyola of Los Angeles.

The All-America candidate gained 122 yards in 31 carries—his poorest performance—as USF posted its first undefeated season in 27 years. The 20 points against Loyola was the smallest the Dons compiled in winning nine straight games.

Detroit Lions Lead National Grid Loop

NEW YORK, (U)—The Detroit Lions want you to know their youthful coach, Buddy Parker, knew what he was talking about when he said "if somebody beats the Chicago Bears, we'll win the title in the National conference of the National football league."

Look at the standings today and you'll see what the Lions mean. Detroit tops the National conference with a record of six victories, two defeats and one tie.

DEADLOCK

The Bears and Los Angeles Rams are deadlocked for second place with six wins and three setbacks each. And they meet next week in another one of the league's naturals. A defeat will just about shove either one out of the running.

The shift in the standings started last Thursday when the Lions defeated Green Bay, 52-35, to go into a three-way tie with the Rams and Bears. Then yesterday the Cleveland Browns and Washington Redskins gave the Lions a helping hand.

SURPRISE

The Browns defeated the Bears, 42-21, to strengthen their position at the head of the American conference with an 8-1 record while the Redskins pulled the surprise of the day by downing the Rams, 31-21.

Meantime, the New York Giants remained at the Browns' heels by shutting out the Chicago Cardinals, 10-0.

In other games, the winless New York Yanks struck from behind in the last quarter to tie the San Francisco 49ers, 10-10, and the Pittsburgh Steelers nipped the Philadelphia Eagles, 17-13.

Duke Jones, formerly of Tulane, was the big gun in the Browns attack, scoring six touchdowns to equal a league single game touchdown record set up by Ernie Nevers while playing with the Cardinals in 1929. Nevers' mark also was made against the Bears.

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Pacific Wins Pear Bowl Tilt

MEDFORD, Ore., (U)—The Pacific university team left here for home Sunday with a 25-7 victory over California Aggies, maintaining the Northwest football conference's perfect record against the Far Western league in the annual Pear Bowl games.

Northwest conference teams now have won all four of the games played since the Bowl was instituted. The Badgers, co-champions of the conference with Lewis and Clark, were behind 7-0 entering the last quarter, but boomed to three touchdowns in the final period of Saturday night's game.

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
